50/4. **30 mph Speed Limit in Satterthwaite and Grizedale Villages**

There is an option to add a 30 mph speed limit for Satterthwaite village to the traffic order already being submitted for Grizedale as part of the Grizedale project. In the absence of any other measures, and with general support in the community, it was agreed to take this forward. **Action -** Clerk to inform Cumbria Highways.
