### **RUSLAND & DISTRICT WI**

Members met on 18 March. The 'Pudding Club' event had been much enjoyed. A final total of £507 had been raised and was donated to the local Community First Responders. On behalf of the Responders, Andrew Stoker thanked the WI for their hard work and generosity saying the money would go towards a defibrillator. ### **COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

Cumbria CC will discontinue support for the popular Lengthsman Scheme which has run in our Parish for the past year. Despite saying that the pilot scheme has been successful, they propose to launch their own 'Highway Steward' Scheme (using Amey) which will be "more cost-effective" for the whole County. They propose 7 Stewards to be based in S Lakeland, performing similar functions as the Lengthsman, plus being responsible for road repair. We estimate that the Highway Steward would only manage ½ day per week here with a likely decline in service. However, there is a glimmer of hope! The Parish Council had already budgeted some funding to support our own Lengthsman in the coming year, and there might be further funding from elsewhere.



These included roadside litter (a clean-up was arranged - thanks to all involved); jackdaw nuisance; a slurry spill into Grizedale beck; new wooden buildings in unexpected places; out-of-season camping; and coach sizes. Officers were appointed for the coming year.

# SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Met on 11 March. There is good news on our search for a new Parish Clerk as a volunteer has come forward. Chair and Vice-chairman will meet to make the appointment before our next meeting (22 April) The council elections will be on the 1st May. Applications for those wishing to stand as councillors close on 4th April so be quick to contact Sue Tiplady for forms if you plan to stand.

A reply from Highways on gritting of the C5022 was inconclusive but not hopeful; we are still awaiting a visit from the Planning Authority to consult on car park options in the village; and we hope to distribute our Holiday Cottage charter letter over Easter.

We discussed the "bad press" that Hawkshead is giving us over the Old Police Station car park but resolved not to further open old wounds. The resolution now imposed by Hawkshead means that residents wishing to use this park will pay £5 for an annual permit. Anyone wishing to understand the whole sorry story is more than welcome to call Paul Townsend. Good news from the Grizedale Consultative Group is the inauguration of a new minibus route from Haverthwaite through Grizedale to Hawkshead with links at both ends (see Page 1)

I am writing this a couple of days after the Rusland Spring Show. What a remarkable display of talent that was!
