COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Colton and Blawith & Subberthwaite Parish Councils held a joint Public Meeting on 11th March about the future of Bouthrey Bridge (over the river Crake), badly damaged in the November floods. The bridge is a Grade II listed doublearch structure which was once an old packhorse bridge. Both Councils had been consulted by Capita-Symonds, for Cumbria Highways, for their opinion on 3 options: i) repair, ii) replacement with like or iii) replacement with a rectangular beam-deck. They had also attended a site meeting with engineers, and representatives from the Environment Agency, English Heritage and the National Park. The public meeting was well attended, and those present voted overwhelmingly for repair of the bridge, rather than re-building. We will report the final decision in due course. Works are scheduled for this summer. Your Council has responded to a government consultation on sites for new nuclear power stations, objecting to the proposed siting of three power stations in such close proximity on the Cumbrian coast. Objections were expressed about the Kirksanton proposal in particular, because of i) its proximity to internationally designated wildlife sites and ii) potential road development schemes affecting our area required to support the consequent heavy traffic.


Deliberations over the phone kiosks at Nibthwaite and Oxen Park have been resolved subject to confirmation of BT's recent change of heart to continue its responsibility for the electricity supply (or disconnection) charges. Both kiosks are to be adopted, with each community thinking up ideas for best use and agreeing to lavish them with loving

care and attention!

CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends.

I saw the first lambs of the year yesterday (21st March). They were very near Rusland Church. I was reminded of the 23rd Psalm, the one which starts, 'the Lord is my Shepherd...' It is many people's favourite bit of Scripture.

In fact shepherds and sheep get talked about quite a lot in the Bible, which means that sometimes in sermons I have to say something about them. You would have thought it would be quite easy to think of something to say about sheep considering that I live so close to so many. But farming in the time of Jesus was so different from modern farming that it can be difficult to draw comparisons. For example, flocks were much smaller, perhaps with just 10 or 20 sheep, and John's Gospel tells us that the shepherd would know each sheep by name. You can correct me if I'm wrong, but I doubt whether most farmers nowadays would have names for all their sheep- Spot, Gentle, Limpy, Blacky, Timid, Fatso, Bossy, Wanderer, and so on; surely you would soon run out of good ideas for sheep names.

Things change, but not everything. One thing I know is this: I really want the Lord to be my shepherd. I want him to be my shepherd because I am told that when I am lost he will look for me, that when I am in danger that his rod and his staff will comfort me. I want a God to watch over me, a God to protect me, a God to bless me, a God to seek me out when I go astray, a God to comfort me when I am hurt, a God to walk with me when I walk through the valley of the shadow of death. All this is promised when we say the Lord is my shepherd.

WOMEN'S WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

Julia Crowe led the service at St. Paul's Church, Rusland on Friday, 5th March, joined by the women of the parishes to the north, south, east and west of Rusland. Cameroonian women set the service, the theme being joy and colour, in spite of the fight these women have against child slavery and oppression. Colourful clothes were worn and colourful food was served. The Rev. Joanna Henson was the speaker whilst Kath Dodd played the keyboard, accompanied by tambourines and drums. All denominations from the area were represented.

COLTON & DISTRICT CHRISTIAN AID COMMITTEE

For 30 years, an annual event in the Rusland Valley has been the Christian Aid Lunch in May held, in recent years, at Rusland Reading Room. Organised by members of Colton, Rusland and Satterthwaite churches, these lunches offered various home-made soups (recipes for which were frequently exchanged,) bread and cheese, a well stocked plant stall, the company of friends from a wide area and – sometimes – some May sunshine. Sadly the strength of the Committee has been greatly depleted in recent years. Some members have died, others have left the district and the stamina of those who remain is not what it was. Therefore it has been reluctantly decided that this year there will be no Christian Aid Lunch at Rusland.The lunches could be resumed in the future, if enough willing helpers step forward, armed with large saucepans and sufficient energy. Any volunteers?

Over the years the Committee has made payments to Christian Aid totalling £29,272, of which about £25,000 came from the lunches. The balance came from donations and collecting boxes. Those who now hold boxes are requested to return them, as soon as possible, to Wendy Smith at Ealinghearth or Edward Collins at Middle Dale Park or, if that is

difficult, to ring the latter on 860312.


