The incoming Park Management ranger for this area will be David Pickup, an experienced ranger who has been working to the west of Coniston Water. His role will be different to my current job and he will be working alongside Andrew Wilkinson, our field ranger. Andrew will been doing most of the practical work for public access and on our properties in the valley. You will be getting two excellent rangers. I will be remaining with the Rusland Valley and Fells Heritage Lottery bid for the next twelve months.


COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Our former Lengthsman, Mr Slater, has decided not to renew his contract for the coming financial year, and we are very sorry to lose his services. This means that we are now looking for a replacement - please see the advertisement below.

There is still no information about how the Council is supposed to liaise with Highways under the new 'Better Highways' scheme. We are all dismayed at the bad state of our roads - especially along the Rusland beeches and the Newby Bridge to Finsthwaite road through Lakeside. Beware also the very large pothole under the flood at the 'field of pigs' above Ealinghearth; we are told that the Environment Agency are taking action in connection with the pollution here and that Highways cannot deal with the road surface until the flooding is solved. We have asked that they place warning signs around the pothole. As always, to report defects, please use the Highways Hotline: 0845 609 6609.

We are chasing the issue of speed limits at Bouth and arranging a site visit with a traffic engineer from Highways. The issue seems to be whether Bouth qualifies as a 'village' and therefore subject to policy on speed limits through villages. Watch this space.

Policing: Sgt Stuart Flett came to explain the new neighbourhood policing arrangements at our last meeting. The 'Ulverston & Lakes' policing area now excludes Dalton and includes the Cartmel peninsula. The High Furness sub-area (which includes Colton) now has ten police officers and two support officers, including our former main contacts PC Baldwin and PCSO Diana Wilcock. SATTERTHWAITE AND RUSLAND C OF E RELIGIOUS EDUCATION FUND

When Satterthwaite School closed the site was sold to Mitre Housing for affordable dwellings. The construction of these dwellings will soon be completed. Part of the proceeds of the sale of the site was used to set up a registered charity; the trustees are the vicar and churchwardens of Satterthwaite and Rusland Churches.

The charity is able to make modest grants to young people aged 19 years or under for purposes connected to Church of England religious education. Applicants (or organisations who work with this age group) should be based in Rusland, Satterthwaite, Hawkshead or Sawrey. The trustees can in appropriate cases consider organisations based in the Windermere Deanery.

The trustees take a wide view as to that which constitutes religious education and in particular encourage applications from those involved in church orientated activities such as church music, bell ringing and pupils projects about churches and/or church activities.

CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends.

What a lot of things were broken during the first Holy Week! There is the broken loyalty of Judas. The betrayal happens with a kiss, usually a sign of love, but here a sign of broken love, broken loyalty.

There are also broken friendships. And here I am thinking about Peter who denied that he knew Jesus. His friendship with Jesus had remained loyal longer than most. But in the courtyard of the High Priest a friendship is broken.

What else is broken? The law is broken. There is a miscarriage of justice.

Because the law was broken the crucifixion could happen. And here a body was broken - broken and battered and crushed. Nails are for attaching pieces of wood to other pieces of wood, not for attaching pieces of wood to flesh. There is a word that is much loved by teachers and social workers and that is the word 'inappropriate'- we talk about 'inappropriate behaviour'. It is inappropriate in the extreme to attach flesh to wood. And Jesus' earthly body is broken.

There are other things broken during Holy Week too. At the last supper which Jesus had with his disciples, which we will remember on Maundy Thursday in Sawrey, bread is broken. And because of this bread is broken in churches all over the world today.

But then comes Easter, with its wonderful stories of resurrection. This is not about things being broken. It is about things being mended. It is about wholeness and healing.

It is interesting that the Gospels tell us that even though Christ had risen from the dead, he still had scars on his hands and feet and side. Our Easter world is not a pretend world, where we say that nothing ever gets broken. Jesus bears the scars of what happened, just as we all bear the scars of the bad things that happen to us. Because of Easter, though, we know that, in the end everything will be alright. In the words of Julian of Norwich we know that 'all shall be well and all shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well.'
