Thank you for your support. Together we can keep a Post Office in the village! Ruth and Gary


THE FASHION OLYMPICS

COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Parish Council Elections: Colton Parish Council elections take place this year on Thursday 3 May. If you would like to join the Council and have more say in how your parish is run, please contact the Clerk for further information and nomination papers (deadline for submission is 4th April). To qualify as a Councillor you need to be 18 years or over, a British subject or a citizen of a member state of the European Union and be (a) an elector of the parish; or (b) a person who over the whole of the last twelve months has been owner or tenant of land or premises in the parish or has lived in the parish or within three miles or has had his principal place of work in the parish.

Field of pigs - successful prosecution: The following statement has recently been issued by the Environment Agency Press Office:

"Local pig farmer, Robert Rose has been issued with a 180 hour community order and fined £5,200 for causing pollution to the beck next to his pig field in Finsthwaite. The Environment Agency brought the prosecution after investigations revealed that drainage from Mr. Rose's site was polluting Black Beck, posing a risk to water quality and wildlife. Mr. Rose was offered help and advice from the Agency aimed at stopping the pollution; however his sentence was imposed because he failed to take sufficient action and the pollution continued. Members of the public and organisations raised complaints about the pollution, from Mr. Rose's site."

We hope now that all the other issues of concern: flooding of the road, escaped pigs, animal welfare, damage, etc. will soon also be addressed.

Our next meeting is the Annual Parish Council Meeting, on Tuesday 8 May, Bouth Village Hall at 7:30pm.Everyone welcome, as usual.

CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends.

A twenty first century reader will find great comedy if he or she looks up what the 1662 prayer book has to say about finding the date of Easter. Here is a little taste:

To find Easter, look for the Golden Number of the year in the first Column of the table, against which stands the day of the Paschal Full Moon; then look in the third column for the Sunday Letter, next after the date of the Full Moon, and the day of the month standing against that Sunday Letter is Easter Day To find the Golden Number, or Prime, add one to the Year of our Lord, and then divide by 19; the remainder, if any, is the Golden Number; but if nothing remaineth, then 19 is the Golden Number. . To find the Sunday Letter, add to the Year of our Lord its fourth part, omitting fractions; and also the number 6; divide the sum by 7; and if there is no remainder, then A is the Sunday Letter . ..

And so on, and so on. It is hardly a handy formula is it? But why not simply fix a date? Well, I can think of a couple of reasons to keep system we have, even if it jars with our modern way of organising calendars.

Firstly, the date is in line with the timing of Passover in the Jewish calendar. And the Jewish calendar was based on the moon, while ours is based on the sun.

Secondly, I would not like a fixed date for Easter precisely because it is a bit inconvenient. It is gloriously right that Easter should keep us guessing, should jump out on us from behind the apparently locked door of ordinary time.

Easter remains a new gift, a fresh gift, a surprise present from the world's creator. Why not explore it more fully by coming along to one or more of our services in churches this Holy Week and Easter?
