

COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Two vacancies occurred on the parish council in January. Clir Margaret Dryden stepped down after 10 years loyal service, due to family commitments and Clir Sylvia Nichols stepped down after 3 years service as she was moving from the area. Several residents expressed an interest in becoming a councillor and an election was called for 16th March. However, in the event only three people submitted applications to SLDC, one of which was declared void so the remaining two applicants were duly elected unopposed without the need for an election. Our new parish councillors are Mrs Sally Baxter representing East Ward and Mrs Penny Lovegrove representing Central Ward. The Council is looking forward to working with both new councillors.

The Annual Parish Meeting was held on Monday 13th March in the Rusland Reading Room but owing to the atrocious weather conditions, it was poorly attended. The next parish council meeting is on Monday 3rd April in Finsthwaite Village Hall at 7.30pm. THE GRIZEDALE PROJECT- WHAT THE LOCALS

Elizabeth Pollock writes: -

Many thanks to all of you who signed the petition asking for a public inquiry into the Forestry Commission's plans for the Grizedale Visitor Centre. Altogether there were 540 names on the petition and over three hundred were of people in the valley and its access points. This petition has been handed on to Tim Faron M.P., who will be formally presenting it to the Deputy Prime Minister and also presenting it on the floor of the House of Commons at the end of the parliamentary day. This procedure will be recorded in Hansard. A copy of the petition has been sent also to Lord Clark of Windermere, the Chairman of the Forestry Commission.

A simple survey of 186 people in the parish of Satterthwaite, suggested that 66% of those asked were opposed to the plans as they stand at the moment, whilst 14 % supported them and 20% preferred not to express an opinion. Hopefully the Commission will understand that people here are deeply interested in their valley and, whilst welcoming visitors and appreciating the financial complexities of timber production, they continue to have real concerns about the effect of increased traffic on our roads.






