#### TARGET OF £50,000 SMASHED

The Leven Valley Support Group for St Mary's Hospice were in celebratory mood after their 17<sup>th</sup> Annual Summer Fair and Car Boot Sale made a profit of £3750. A further sum of £620 was raised in March to help defray expenses, enabling a cheque for £4370 to be presented to the Hospice, bringing the total amount of money, raised by the Group, to £52.848

Don't forget the AGM on Tuesday 14th August at 7.30pm - films with a local flavour followed by the AGM at 8pm.


#### **COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

Congratulations to Anne Robinson of Crosslands Farm who was co-opted as councillor for Colton Parish Central Ward at the meeting on 25<sup>th</sup> June, replacing Ron Mein who retired in May. We are all looking forward to working with her.

After many months of pressure being put on Cumbria County Council Highways Department by Ron Mein about the dangerous state of the collapsed road alongside Ashes Beck outside Roger Ridding Farm, a date has been set to rebuild the retaining wall. Work will begin at 8.00am Monday 13th August and is expected to take 7 weeks. A diversion will be signed through Thwaite Moss. The government has introduced a new Statutory Instrument 1159 (2007) - the Local Authorities Code of Conduct Order 2007, which all local and parish councils must adopt, and all councillors must sign by October 2007. Councils are obliged by law to advertise the fact that this new order has been adopted, with particular reference to paragraph 12 (2), which applies to Parish Councils. Colton Parish Council adopted this at their meeting on 25th June. There is a link to the new Code of Conduct on the website. www.coltonparishcouncil.org.uk, The summer newsletter has been distributed to all Colton Parish households. An electronic version can be viewed on our website, where you can also see, amongst other pages, details of the minutes of meetings and details of the forthcoming Rusland Show on 18th August 2007.

The next parish council meeting will be on 3rd September at Colton Church Hall at 7.30pm, when a representative of the Parish Paths Initiative will address the meeting.

members and friends- this is to be an open meeting.

The meeting of 9th July heard a presentation of our recent Housing Needs Survey, given by Judith Darbyshire of the Cumbria Rural Housing Trust. The survey shows a need for 12 affordable homes for local people. Thanks to all who returned their forms and answered any further questions from Judith at the time of the survey. This is just the supportive data needed to help the "School House Project" move forward. Lynne McKenzie of the Eden Housing Association showed the Council its plans for seven affordable homes on the School site. There are three dwellings to be made from the existing buildings and four new built dwellings in two blocks. The planning application should go in within the next few weeks. With an eye on conservation, Mark Street of the FC suggested that a wood fuelled heating system for the houses be considered, as will be used at the Grizedale Centre. A second meeting was arranged at short notice as a result of a planning application received just before the 9th July meeting. The council considered an application from Bowkerstead Farm to use the whole of one field for camping, without a fenced division, in order to permit more sympathetic spacing of tent sites and maintaining the field for its off-season agricultural use. As this change to the previous planning approval did not mean an increase in numbers of site pitches, the council unanimously supported the amendment. Our next meeting will be on 17th September.

#### Church News

Dear Friends.

I regularly write a piece here and other things elsewhere on behalf of the Church, but I wonder what we actually mean by 'the Church'? Perhaps we might do well to look at how Jesus used the word.

There is a major turning point in the story of Jesus. This is when Peter states his belief that Jesus is the Messiah, the chosen one of God. Jesus then tells Peter that on this rock he will build the church- that very word, church. The Gospels were written in Greek and the word that is translated as church, ekklesia. The word is nothing to do with a building; it actually originally meant a gathering of the people. One of the contexts in which the word was used was when a crowd gathered in the market place or a square to hear an important message.

So, the word we translate as church would have been very familiar to the first readers of the Gospel, but was being used by Jesus in a very different context. Not a building, not an institution, but people sharing good news. It is an event, a movement flowing on through history.

And that is what it still is. The ekklesia was and is always the gathered people.


