We will be receiving detailed feedback from the Assessment Board in due course but understand that ours was considered to be a strong bid among many. In fact, there was a total of 36 and these have been whittled down to just 11 which are to receive funding.

A lot of hard work was done by a Steering Group which included several people from the local community and this outcome is extremely disappointing. Once we have seen the detailed comments, we will decide whether to have another go next year.



COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Thank you to everyone who came along on 15th June. for an informal meeting with Nigel Williams and his colleagues from the Forestry Commission, to gather views on how the woodland should be managed. The FC are keen for communities to have a say in developing management plans for local woods like Old Hall. They hope that local people will want to become involved in monitoring wildlife, improving paths and drainage, and in woodland industries, for example. At this informal walk around the wood, the general concensus was for a 'light touch' management approach, with some small-scale coppicing work to open up glades for wildlife sites and viewpoints. The existing paths would be improved, drains unblocked, and some overhanging vegetation cut back.

The future of the larch by the roadside and the area of spruce at the top of the wood was discussed at some length. The FC intends to thin the larch plantation at the bottom of the hill, but the spruce at the top would be difficult and costly to remove. Although national policy is focussed on the restoration of broadleaf woodlands, allowing some conifers to remain actually maximises biodiversity, providing important winter cover and an essential food source for some species, for example red squirrels (the larch), siskins and redpolls (the spruce). An obvious solution for the spruce seemed to be to leave it alone to provide wildlife and landscape benefits; over time, some trees will succumb to wind-throw, leaving some to become mature specimens. We hope that Bouth residents will be keen to take this community woodland plan forward, and so we have arranged a meeting with the FC to be held during August at Bouth Village Hall. A provisional date of 10th August, 7.30 pm has been pencilled in, but not yet confirmed. Look out for notices on the Village Green board shortly. Our next Parish Council meeting is on Monday 12th

CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends,

We sometimes talk about 'healing' in church. What do we mean by this? Well, rather than tell you what we mean, I can say what I mean.

Unlike modern medicine, the healing ministry of the church is not primarily to do with physical healing. It is to do with spiritual healing. We certainly wouldn't say 'Do away with hospitals, come to church instead.'

The central message of the Bible and especially the ministry of Jesus is a message about our spiritual and not our physical health. Even where there are physical healings the healing is usually an outward sign of some spiritual healing.

The healing ministry of the church is about enabling people to know the peace of Christ and the love of God. It is about wholeness. Many many people gain great benefit and sustenance from such opportunities. Talk of healing in church is a powerful expression of faith: faith in the possibility of wholeness, wholeness for ourselves, wholeness for others, and wholeness for the world.

I have no doubt at all that this sense of peace and wholeness does sometimes result in physical healing. But even if it does not, there is healing in the knowledge of God's presence and unconditional love even if the person does not get better in the medical sense.

In other words we can be healed by having pain taken away, and we can be healed by knowing that God is alongside us in our suffering, reaching out and sharing our pain and grief. It is this act of sharing which is God's central act of atonement with the created world.
