RUSLAND and DISTRICT WI

We are not able to meet but daily emails and phone calls are now a feature of our WI life. We cancelled our March meeting and in April we were to have a very special meeting with a singer from English Touring Opera who was going to perform and get us all to sing too. We hope this will happen next year.

CITIZENS ADVICE

Q. I'm from Austria and I know I need to apply for Settled Status now the UK has left the European Union. But I'm really confused about what documents I need in order to apply for me and my children. I'm worried that we might have to leave.

A. Your rights won't change until 31 December 2020. However, you should apply as soon as you can in case of any delays. After that date you might be asked to prove your right to do things like get a job or use a service like the NHS.

You need evidence that you've lived in the UK for 6 months out of every 12 months for 5 years in a row. You will need a passport or national ID card, a digital photo, your National Insurance number or proof of how long you've lived in the UK, a mobile number and an email address. If you've been working, you can find your National Insurance number on your pay slip.

If you make your children's application after you've made your own, you can 'link' your child's application to yours, using your own application number. If your own application is successful, your child will get the same status as you. You will need to have proof of your relationship - for example a birth certificate.

Colton Parish Council kindly granted the money for Kez (Samara Henderson) to craft a sign based on a logo design by Toby Travis, from the local Quaker families' weekends. Jack Holden from Mountain Oak woodcraft provided a beautiful piece of seasoned oak, of which he said "This must be the finest piece of oak in Cumbria!"

As David unveiled the sign he said, "Rookhow is one of the most important buildings in the parish and it's something we should really make more of."



£4,000 FROM DULVERTON TRUST
