DALE PARK RAINFALL

The total for February was only 2.43" with 13 dry days.

March started off well with only .26" of rain until the10th, and there were 8 dry days. Since then, up to 21^{st,} there has not been a dry day and there has been 6.4" of rain, taking the total for March so far to 8.56". February and March last year were the opposite way round, with February having 10.57" and March only 2.89".

The yearly total so far is 23.41" which is 6" more than at this time last year. The dry days, though, are about the same for both years.

CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends.

We did not choose to be born, any of us. But when we were a child each of us realised at some point that we were alive. We realised that we were in the midst of an astonishing, beautiful, exhilarating drama. We became aware of life. We may just be a tiny speck in the story of everything, but that tiny speck is what everything we know depends on. Our lives are astonishing: full of energy, creativity, vigour, joy. And precious beyond any measure.

But a little bit later, maybe as we become teenagers, we realise that life is not the only thing in play. There is something that comes to everyone, to everything, that takes the joy out of life. Death is a mystery, just as deep and impenetrable as life. Why is there life? We do not often ask the question, but we are usually glad there is. But if there's life, why is there death? It is unthinkable, intolerable, unjust. What is the point of life if we just have to face death? Do we fear, deep down, that death eventually wins, every time? Death thinks it has got the better of life – it will always win in the end. It will destroy, dismantle and discredit everything, and turn it to dust.

But at Easter, which we celebrate this month, we discover again that there is something death hasn't bargained for. And that is love. We discover again that as well as the glorious mystery of life and the fearful mysteries of death, there is a third mystery: that love is stronger than death. We discover resurrection. Resurrection is the way human beings reach out from the constraints of life and touch forever. And resurrection even more wonderfully is the way forever reaches out from beyond death and touches us with its truth. Anybody is very welcome to explore this mystery by joining us at our Easter services.


