## CHURCH NEWS

## Dear Friends,

A twenty first century reader will find great comedy if they look up what the 1662 Prayer Book has to say about finding the date of Easter. Here is a little taste:

To find Easter, look for the Golden Number of the year in the first Column of the table, against which stands the day of the Paschal Full Moon; then look in the third column for the Sunday Letter, next after the date of the Full Moon, and the day of the month standing against that Sunday Letter is Easter Day... To find the Golden Number, or Prime, add one to the Year of our Lord, and then divide by 19; the remainder, if any, is the Golden Number; but if nothing remaineth, then 19 is the Golden Number... To find the Sunday Letter, add to the Year of our Lord its fourth part, omitting fractions; and also the number 6; divide the sum by 7; and if there is no remainder, then A is the Sunday Letter...

And so on. It does not really seem like a handy formula. Why didn't they just Google it? Actually why not simply fix a date? Well, I can think of a couple of reasons to keep system we have, even if it jars with our modern way of organising calendars. Firstly, the date is in line with the timing of Passover in the Jewish calendar. And the Jewish calendar was based on the moon, while ours is based on the sun. Secondly, I would not like a fixed date for Easter precisely because the system we have is a bit inconvenient. It is gloriously right that Easter should keep us guessing, should jump out on us from behind the apparently locked door of ordinary time. Easter remains a new gift, a fresh gift, a surprise present from the world's creator. Three words take us by surprise again, three words which turn sadness into hope, despair into life, grief into joy. Those three words are: Christ is risen. Why not explore them by coming along to one or more of our services in churches this Holy Week and Easter.

Our first 'official' event as a CWT Rusland Group made a brilliant effort in removing invasive rhododendron from Black Beck woods on a lovely spring day. Well done everyone who came along. Our next event is a 'Dawn Chorus Walk' on 10th May in Stoney Hazel woods to enjoy listening and learning to identify different birds from their song. There are just a few places left – go to the Cumbria Wildlife Trust What's On pages to book or find the link on the 'Wild About Rusland' Facebook group. Keep a look-out for a Moth and Butterfly event planned for late June.
