RUSLAND VALLEY MOSSES SSSI

Following the Public Meeting in September 2011 the community raised the point that further hydrological investigations should take place to assess the condition of the hydrology of the site. Natural England agreed that this is a prudent measure and has funded this. In May 2012, the installation was completed and data is currently being gathered and analysed.

The first interim report was finished in July. This is now available for viewing. To this end, Natural England is making this available on the Rusland Valley Community website, along with the previous report compiled by JBA Consultants.

Natural England have also commissioned a photographic realisation of the mosses should any restorative works be necessary. These will be available in the Autumn.

DOGS

Mandy Lane, Clerk, Colton Parish Council writes: -SLDC are currently consulting on proposals for 'Clean Streets and Neighbourhoods'. This includes a proposal to get all dog owners to pick up dog poo in all open land to which the public have access. At first we thought this was just towns/villages/play areas etc. (quite right!) – but it seems, on asking for clarification that it means open rural areas too. SLDC say:

"The expression 'open land' covers land where people have access to exercise and roam (whether they have to pay for access or not), which is not necessarily only land owned by local authorities. For example common land, the land of both National Parks and the National Trust within South Lakeland would be included. It is not intended to include private land. "

A number of us (and not just the dog owners) are concerned that this is going to mean a deluge (god forbid) of plastic bags full of poo all over the fells – far less environmentally friendly, and they don't tend to stay sealed anyway so then you have both the bags AND the poo. Unless SLDC are planning to put dog bins all over the fells, and pay for someone to empty them? Seems unlikely. (NT people: I have alerted John Moffit who was not aware and has concerns – the rangers are already concerned about this unpleasant phenomenon and don't want more of it....).

Personally, I like the Forestry Commission approach: "No one likes to see discarded dog waste bags. We are trying to encourage people to use 'stick and flick' in the forest, If your dog fouls the path in the forest please use a stick to remove the waste from the path into the undergrowth where it can break down naturally. If your dog fouls near the information centre, car parks or other sensitive areas we ask you pick up the waste and use the normal waste bins provided."

Personally – I train my dog to go off the path anyway. So – whatever your feelings, you might want to respond to the consultation. If you do then go to:

SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL

At the last meeting on 2nd July PC Adrian Golbourn presented a general briefing and a specific round up of recent policing in the parish: 24/6 concern for welfare log at Bogle Crag; 23/6 somebody out lamping for foxes; 21/6 minor accident at Graythwaite; and, 20/6 off road motorcycles seen at Moor Lane. To combat illegal off-roading, the council resolved to be pro-active and would seek action in the parish to combat this nuisance.

Considering the grant of £800 from the HF LAP for verge maintenance: councillors agreed to increase the allowance for improvement of Nursery Lane to £400; Cllr Thomason to acquire filling for larger holes in the lane; a survey of the parish will be done after scheduled cutting of verge edges; and, Cllr Thomason to arrange meeting with David Huck (Cumbria County Council) and David Lowe (Forestry Commission). The council will continue to monitor the state of the road between Satterthwaite and Grizedale. Martin Elson, Engineer, Cumbria Highways, has said he will be ordering the work (that is, the repairing of the bank and allowing a hedge to be reinstated) but was unable to give a date when it will take place.

The council expressed concern about increasing evidence of dog-fouling in the centre of the village and will consult the police about preventative action. Councillors are to meet informally in August to review the Satterthwaite Community Plan prior to an advisory meeting with Julia Wilson, Project Team Manager,



COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Vacancy in West Ward: Councillor Brenda Fishwick from Nibthwaite has decided to stand down after 4 years because of new commitments. We will miss Brenda's lively personality and active role on the Council. We therefore have a vacancy in west ward. If you want to help shape local policy for this area, then do consider putting yourself forward for co-option - contact the Clerk (details below). West ward extends from the River Crake eastwards to include Nibthwaite, Spark Bridge (east), Ickenthwaite, Oxen Park, Colton and Tottlebank; you need to live or work within the ward or within 3 miles of it as the crow flies. New Parish Member for the National Park Authority: Your Parish Council Chairman, Colin Barr, has been elected onto the National Park Authority by the parish councils in South Lakeland. He was successful against five other candidates, stating his belief that local communities need a strong representation on the body that controls the Park's management and direction. He has been appointed to the Development Control Committee which meets each month to consider planning applications and enforcement issues. New Colton Housing Need Survey - interim results: The Cumbria Rural Housing Trust has sent some initial results from the latest survey, pending a full analysis. A 25% return rate* from survey forms sent to 458 addresses yielded 9 forms (equating to 12 households) stating a need for affordable housing. The CRHT will assess these. Most were for adult children living with parents, with the remainder for older people in need of alternative accommodation. (*According to council tax records, 30% of houses in the Parish are non-main residences, so the 25% return rate was not unexpected.) CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends.

A couple of quotations which got me thinking:

'The youth is rotten to the very bottom of their hearts: the young people are malicious and lazy, and they will never be as youth used to be before. Today's youth will not be able to maintain our culture' and secondly:

'Our youth loves luxury, has lack of manners, disregards authority and has no respect whatsoever for older people; today's children are tyrants; they contradict their parents and tyrannise their teachers- they are just very bad.'

Many people would say, 'How true!' Others who are younger will wince at yet another sweeping and insulting statement about their generation, and will probably have stopped reading by now.

In fact, these sentiments may not be anything particularly new. These quotations are not from letters to The Telegraph. The first outburst was inscribed on a pot in Babylon, dating from about 2000 BC; the second is attributed to Socrates in about 400 BC. The older generation have always been concerned about the behaviour of the younger and probably always will be.

But there is a tendency in all human beings to seek blame other people for all that is wrong with the world. We might blame the youth, or the foreigner, or women (if we happen to be men) and, no doubt, men if you are a woman.

The author of the message on the Babylonian pot was concerned that his culture was going to come to an end and that it was going to be the fault of the young people, or at least that's who he blamed. In fact, he needn't have worried too much- his particular culture lasted for another 1500 years at least.
