A HAPPY ANNIVERSARY EVENING

Saturday, 19th July was the eagerly awaited date of the Rusland & District W.I. 70th Anniversary celebrations, held in the Rusland Reading Room. The Institute was founded in July 1944, so the theme of the party was 1940s, and about 40 past and present members gathered to enjoy themselves. Janet Taffs, President, welcomed everyone and a spirited rendering of Jerusalem followed. After a wonderful supper, prepared by Anne Robinson, the toast to the Institute was proposed by Doris Aldworth from the Federation Executive. The cake, baked by Judy Shaw and iced by Mary Burrow was cut by our two longest serving members, Elsie Wilkinson and Jennifer Threlkeld. The hat competition took place next, with several members wearing the 1940s - style hats they had made for the occasion. Sonia Brown won and was presented with a tin of Spam! The wartime raffle (tickets 1s.) was drawn and those lucky enough to win a prize were delighted to receive goods which included 1/2lb. of butter, a bag of sugar, dried fruit and eggs - all very desirable 70 years ago! The 1940s table quiz, set by Edward Collins, was won by Doris Aldworth and Jackie Huck, who received slabs of Cadbury's Dairy Milk. Paul Gregson then played a medley of 1940s songs which we all sang with gusto, waving our Union Jacks. The merry evening ended with the singing of the National Anthem.

OUR TALENTED YOUNG LOCALS!

DEGREE SUCCESS for Laura Bright who gained a 1st from Salford University in Law and Criminology and Rachael Farnworth who gained a 2.1 BA (Honours) in History from Northumberland University.

SAILING - Two local sailors, Reuban Fox-Copley from Backbarrow (former Rusland and Satterthwaite School pupil) and Fergus Meanwell from Rusland, were selected to be part of the Cumbria Under 18 team and travelled to Deal in Kent for the National Under 18 Sailing Championships. This was particularly challenging as both boys were competing against sailors a lot older than themselves, and in unfamiliar tidal seas. There were 329 boats from all over the UK.

The boys competed in a series of races for a week, and were coached by 3 Olympic sailors as part of the event. At the end of the week Fergus was 5th, sailing a Feva, and Reuban was 31st, sailing a topper. Reuban was also selected to compete in the Mount Hays Trophy, where each of the counties competed against each other in unfamiliar boats, along the seafront in front of 1000 excited spectators.

FELL RUNNING - Oscar Meanwell has come 4th overall in the British Fell Running Championships for under 18s. He was also second in the British Uphill Championships held at Turner Hall Farm in the

SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Satterthwaite Parish Council last met on 24th July.

Although unable to attend, PCSO Emma Forrester emailed a report for the period 3/6/14 – 24/7/14. There were 3 crimes reported to Cumbria Police during this time [1 burglary and 2 thefts] and one non-crime matter [a noise nuisance].

Operation TRICE, that is, the patrolling of rural car parks, is ongoing. Burglary rates are low in Hawkshead and Satterthwaite but you need to be aware of what you can do to prevent becoming a victim of an opportunistic burglar. Thieves exploit open windows and doors, often while householders are asleep upstairs or when they are just in the back garden. Many thieves are opportunists who do not plan their crimes. The vast majority of burglaries are committed in this way. What we ask is don't make it easy for them! Remember:

- Don't leave windows open in unattended rooms.
- Don't leave valuables near windows and never where they can be seen from outside.
- Make sure doors are kept locked.
- Never leave keys outside your home burglars know where to look.
- Don't leave property in a porch, even if the door is usually shut.
- Use timer switches to turn the lights on inside your home when you are out.
- Where possible, fit a house alarm.

During PCSO Forrester's holiday period, if there are any issues that you would like a community officer to look into, please contact Sergeant 1308 Bill Nolan on 101 Option 2 ext 41308. PCSO Forrester will return on 13th August.

There were 2 Planning items: the application from Hill Top House was granted planning permission and the parish council resolved to submit no objections to the application from The Heald for pruning and felling works.

In response to the grant proffered by the Rusland Valley Heritage Fund for a seat\bench for the recreation and play area, Councillor Mike Thornley is to investigate if it could be made by a local craftsman.



Councillor Grant Nickson is to explore the creation of a parish council website [linked still to the community site] to expand council's publication of its work.

After 3 complaints to the parish council, the lengthsman is to be asked to work on Breasty Haw. Councillor Mike Thornley will organise a group of volunteers to supplement the lengthsman's work there.

The clerk attended the South Distinctive Area Tour at Backbarrow and Haverthwaite. He reported the event as a successful insight into other parishes' problems. Councillor Fletcher reported on grants awarded by the High Furness Neighbourhood Forum to Oxen Par Cinema, Woodlands and Lowick, and gave an update on Broadband

provision in the area (much still to be done!).

The next meeting is on Tuesday 16th September 2014 at 7.30pm in the Parish Room.

CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends,

Religion, according to Richard Dawkins, is 'the root of all evil'. Hatred, violence, intolerance and bigotry are sustained and inflamed by religious propaganda. The world would be better off without it.

Obviously, I don't agree. My job rather depends on it not being the root of all evil, but the argument is compelling, or at least it seems so. Think of all the wars that have been fought in the name of religion. Think of the Crusades.

But there again couldn't we say the same thing about politics? Some political regimes have caused millions of deaths. If we say that religion is the root of much hatred, then we should apply the same argument to politics. The truth is that some forms of politics are bad, just as some forms of religion are bad, but we as human beings are not going to do away with either politics or religion; we need both of them. Politics is necessary to human life. We need some form of social organisation. And we also need religion: we need some sense of ultimate value and meaning to give significance to our existence.

It is the job of ordinary decent human beings to make sure that our religion and politics are used for good and don't become corrupt. Our faith of our churches is not about hatred. That is absurd. It is about love, a love which recognises every single other person as a lovely, valuable, true child of God.
