#### **AWARD WINNING BOOK**

#### HELICOPTER SPRAYING ON BETHECAR MOOR

Bracken is to be sprayed on a northern section of Bethecar Moor, by helicopter, as part of a conservation measure to encourage a rare butterfly (the high brown fritillary) to flourish on the Moor. This is planned to take place during early August but could be postponed to later in the month if the weather is unfavourable. During the spraying, notices will be positioned at entry points to the Moor warning against entry and people positioned at the main entry points to the Moor will be able to give advice on safety.



#### Dear Friends.

Imagine you are on a beach. It is a perfectly ordinary beach. In fact, perhaps you might say it is a little too ordinary, a bit boring in fact. You put on a pair of goggles and go for a swim.

And once in the water for the first time in your life you see a tropical reef, just there not far below the surface. You are struck by the rich variety of colours, the iridescent profusion if fish, the wondrous patterns of corals and sponges and anemones. It is the most beautiful thing you have ever seen. It is all you can do to stop yourself laughing out loud, which would be a mistake with your head underwater.

When you climb out of the water you look back to where you have just been swimming. With the refraction of sun and sky and the turbulence of the waves, all you can see is an uninteresting shadowy rocky formation below the rolling sea.

We don't have to go to a tropical reef for something like that to happen. In all sorts of situations there can be moments when it seems like something falls away, and we see deeper, below the surface of everyday attention, and we get a glimpse of an unseen beauty and wonder that seems to expand our consciousness.

Perhaps those moments don't happen as often as we wish they would, but they can and do happen. A new angle on life can reveal to us the depth of beauty in places and people that we usually take for granted. John
