ORIENTEERING EVENT IN DALE PARK. FRIDAY 3RD AUGUST

Some of you will know what this means – lots (100's) of cars will arrive in Dale Park from 08.30 until 12noon and then will depart from 12,30 until 4ish.

Most people will come from the south (Haverthwaite crossroads). Please pass the word around and remind the postman and milk tanker driver if you see them. Travelling against this traffic could be frustrating to say the least.

The Graythwaite woods above Dale Park offer some of the best orienteering in Britain - lovely open mature woodland with complex details of contour & rock features not to mention the amazing, magical large scale special map you would get. This event is the last of the 2018 'Lakes 5 Days' event and should prove popular with the 1000+ competitors or all ages(5 – 85). If you are curious then there is 'entry on the day' for beginners and intermediate level map readers. Go to 'enquiries' and find out what you should do to enter.

SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

We invited Neil Morris and David Higgs to come to the last meeting to tell the council about First Responders. At the moment there are only four First Responders to cover from Ambleside down to Backbarrow and across to Coniston. They have airwaves pagers and they will respond to as many callouts as possible due to their location and work commitments. First Responders do not attend trauma callouts such as road traffic accidents. They deal mainly with heart attacks, strokes, diabetes, and minor incidents where they can get to the casualty fast. They have helped four local communities in the area utilise their unused phone boxes to house defibrillators, bought with donations and local fundraising activities. They have offered to help Satterthwaite Parish Council do the same thing. The cost of the project will be approximately £2000 and involve acquiring the phone box from BT and the purchase and installation of the defibrillator. It will be accessible to anyone who needs to use it by contacting the emergency services to obtain the access code. We will be putting out collection boxes soon in the village and other local areas so please give generously, it could save your life or someone you care about. Tracy Coward has offered to help us to apply for funding for the Car Parking Project in Satterthwaite. The Parish Council is to put in a formal application in to SLDC for advice on planning for the Car Parking Project This is a free service, which will allow us to progress with the work.

At a meeting to discuss the Satterthwaite and Rusland Rural Crime Initiative it was announced we have funding for two cameras and we will be siting the first camera in the next few weeks along with signs to notify people they are entering and area with CCTV surveillance. We need to secure a site for the other camera.

Dear Friends,

Do you ever visit churches when you are on holiday? We are so lucky here that we are able to keep the churches of the Benefice open during the day, and they all receive visitors.

People visit churches on holiday for all sorts of different reasons. It may be something you have done yourself in other places. You go into a church building, perhaps because it is an attractive building, architecturally and socially interesting, or perhaps because it is something to do, perhaps because it is cool inside on a hot day, or dry when it is raining. You look around, and then, because your feet are tired, you have a little sit down and a quiet moment.

And then maybe what you find is that the experience is somehow more than the sum of its parts. You are doing more than just sitting quietly in an old building.

This is perhaps partly because we so rarely sit quietly and do nothing, or because, no matter what we believe, it is moving to be in a building that has been set aside for prayer and worship, a building that exists because of a belief that there is more to life than our day-to-day concerns. And it is a place where many people before us have found something similar. As a Christian I believe that this is one of the ways in which God speaks to us. It is our hope and prayer that people find something significant in our churches, whatever they choose to call it. John
