OUR RESIDENT TRIATHLETE TRIUMPHS AGAIN! Ren Brennan from Satterthwaite had a great victory in the Cross Triathlon European Championships in Targu Mares, Romania. Ren won the women's 45-49 class after a superb running stage that allowed her to hold off rival Beatriz Molina Garcia of Spain, After a difficult start, having gone out too fast in the swim, Ren made up ground in the off-road cycling stage; all that training on the Grizedale hills paid off as she stayed on her bike on the hills while the rest of the field had to walk. She overtook Molina then held her lead. They went through transition and out on to the run with Beatriz the Spaniard just ahead. With Ren praying that her legs would hold up and come good, she settled in behind her opposition. They were equal on the downs. The run is pretty brutal with a very steep 1km. uphill. Ren gained a metre, then another. She managed to pull away and fly the second lap of the run to beat her rival by two minutes to gain victory, taking two hours forty minutes and nine seconds. Well done Ren - an amazing performance.

HELICOPTER SPRAYING ON BETHECAR MOOR Bracken is to be sprayed on a North West section of Bethecar Moor by helicopter as part of a conservation measure to encourage a rare butterfly (the high brown fritillary) to flourish on the Moor. This is planned to take place during early August but could be postponed to later in the month if the weather is unfavourable. During the day of spraying, notices will be positioned at entry points to the Moor warning against entry.

SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Firstly, thank you to everyone who came to our Pizza Night on 13th July, it was a very successful evening and raised £311 towards the defibrillator. The food was amazing so a particular thank you to Simon Brock for making the delicious bases and toppings and for all his hard work cooking the fantastic pizzas until late on in the evening. It was really lovely to catch up with people who we haven't seen for a while or we just haven't met before, and to meet new people who have moved into the area. Everyone seemed to have enjoyed themselves so we will be planning another social event later in the year.

We are waiting to find out the exact cost of the defibrillator from Neil Morris, who is currently on holiday, but we have raised a staggering amount of £1725 and we are still expecting a £100 from Tracy Coward, and we have a few more donations that have been promised. Many thanks to Jenny Armstead and the Eagle's Head for donations from events they have organised and to everyone else who has kindly donated.

We have received a few complaints lately regarding Machell's Coppice, a Forestry Commission Car Park situated on the east of the lake road below Brantwood. We received correspondence from Forestry England saying: - "With regard to Machell's Coppice car park we have seen an increase in antisocial behaviour which has resulted in unacceptable levels of litter and use of the site as a toilet facility. This has resulted in complaints from neighbours and LDNPA volunteers who help with the litter issue. The site is also on a number of online forums as a free wild camping site which further exacerbates the situation.

As a solution we plan to temporarily close the northern half to break the habit of usage but keep the southern half open. This is very visible to the road and should attract less undesirable behaviour.

We will review the usage over the next few weeks and decide what the best course of action should be in the

One further point is that this area also acts as a timber transfer point for harvesting operations. We will be harvesting above Machell's in the future and so the whole of the car park will need to be closed for the duration of those operations"

We also had a number of complaints about noise from Amifest at Bowkerstead Farm. These will be discussed in more detail at the next meeting.

We are hoping to get a sign made for the end of Nursery Lane, letting people know that we have a play area and also a tennis court in the village.

The next meeting will be held at the Forestry Commission Offices on 9th September 2019 at 7.30pm.
