

Parking at High Dam Car Park Although The Lake District National Park had indicated that a pay meter would be installed in the car park in June this year this has not happened to date. We now assume installation will take place in the New Year. The main concern of residents is that this will displace parked vehicles from the car park onto the highway thereby causing obstructions. Despite the delay in installing the pay meter, signage has recently been erected by LDNP to ask visitors to" park considerately". One local resident, with a sense of humour, did ask if this was an invitation to park next to the signs! However the purpose of the signs is to ask that if drivers do park on the highway then they give clearance to field gates and the drives of

The Boundary Commission has recently issued a report for consultation on proposed boundary changes which is part of the Government's drive to reduce the number of Members of Parliament. This has suggested a redrafting of boundaries for Cumbria based on five rather than six members. The significance to Colton Parish is that we would become part of a new Copeland Constituency! The Commission based this on a desk exercise, trying to make each constituency broadly similar in voter numbers, and accept that this might be ignoring many relevant factors. We have therefore made a submission to the effect that this would be totally inappropriate. HELP US CHANGE THINGS FOR THE BETTER

As well as helping people on a one-to-one basis with problems once they have happened, your local CAB also tries to tackle the root cause of the problem by gathering information about unfair practices and policies. We then campaign for change and improvements locally, regionally and nationally. This helps everyone, even people who never come to the bureau. We call this 'Social Policy'. Last month the CAB in Windermere and Grange emailed 250 local employers with a free Employment guide covering all the basics of what to do when an employee starts, leaves, or there when there is a problem. Our small bureau deals with 500 employment problems a year, much more than the national average and we are trying to prevent future problems by helping Employers get it right first time. CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends.

I want to tell you about the most dramatic power cut I have ever experienced. It was some years ago now and Judith and I were in central London with the two children, who were then very small. While we were there, there was a power cut which made national news. For a few hours there were no tubes or mainline trains running to take us back to where we were staying. Instead, we joined the really quite desperate crowds trying to muscle their way on to buses which were already full-to-bursting. Needless to say, of course, that we did make it back in the end- it just took much longer than expected and was much more of a hassle.

It was incredible to think that a short time without electricity could cause so much chaos. Electricity has become so much part of our lives that we seemingly struggle to live without it, even for a short while. It is almost impossible to imagine that there was once a time, and not very long ago, when electricity as something that could be useful was unheard of. This is a striking time of year to be reminded of that fact. As the nights close in, the world around us changes dramatically- we get up while it is still dark outside, and then it is dark again by mid-afternoon. Just think what it would be like without electric lights! The dark months would feel very dark.

No wonder, when the nights are dark and cold, light seems such a good spiritual symbol, a symbol perhaps of goodness. Many of the world's religions celebrate festivals to do with light in the coming months- Diwali, Hanukah, Christmas.

As Christians, we call Jesus the light of the world- he shines in the darkness (even after the clocks go back). And just as a little bit of light can lighten the darkest corner, so a little bit of the light of Christ can and does lighten the darkest moments in our lives. Happy Christmas.
