

What is Christmas all about? Family gatherings? Presents? A big dinner? Mistletoe and wine? Yes, it is about all these things. But I am sort of contractually obliged to say at this point that it is really about the birth of Jesus, God coming among us as a baby.

What I want to say this year, though, is that even for the most devout Christian it is not just about the birth of Jesus.
