## COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

#### Winter Preparation

As part of our winter preparations, we have been checking the grit bins and heaps around our local lanes. If there is one near you that needs topping up or you have identified a spot where a grit heap would help the local community if the weather turns icy, please report it to Westmorland and Furness Council To report a salt heap or salt bin that requires a refill:

- · Find out the What3Words location or nearest postcode
- Follow the link to Cumbria Highways on the Westmorland and Furness Council website
- · Select "report a problem" then type in salt bin/salt heap in the search box and follow the instructions.

You can use this service to report other problems such as potholes, flooding and other hazards.

Autumn is always a busy season for our lengthsman Archie. He has been out on a regular basis clearing drains of leaves and dirt as well as keeping our lanes debris free. Through the contract that the Parish Council has with Westmorland and Furness Archie is permitted to work or minor roads, where it is safe for him to do so, If you notice a problem on a minor road or lane you can contact the clerk at Colton Parish Council. We will then work with Archie to assess if the work is something within our scope and can be safely undertaken. If not, it can be reported to WFC. We have sent an updated list of current urgent priority items that Archie is not able to deal with to our District Councillor, Suzanne Pender and to the highways manager at WFC.

Community Plan Consultation - The Business Voice

Thank you to everyone who completed a questionnaire as part of our community plan consultation. We are now seeking local business views via our Business Consultation so we can feed in the priorities for businesses based in the Colton Parish Council Area. We hope to hold an informal community get together in January to help us confirm priority actions.

#### DALE PARK RAINFALL

October rainfall was 8.03" and 6 dry days (2022 10.69" 3dry). November to 25<sup>th</sup> is 8.96" and 5 dry days - 2022 10.2". The year's total rainfall to date is 84.3" (2022 66") 2023 has seen 1.5 ft. more rain than last year.

SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS Emma Nield has been co-opted on the Satterthwaite Parish Council. This completes our number of Councillors. We happily welcome to Emma to the Parish Council.

A number of residents are concerned about the migration of a normal BT landline to a digital phone. Unfortunately, this is not something that is just local to us it is a national scheme. There is more information in the minutes on the Parish website.

Alison Leyshon from Forestry England also attended our meeting with updates.

Events at Grizedale 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> December there will be the Grizedale Stages Rally. Using Grizedale East on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> and Grizedale West and Broughton Moor on 2<sup>nd</sup>.

<u>Canicross</u> – A route is being laid out this year and it will be run every 3 months.

Low Bowkerstead Self Catering Cottage – Closed now for redecoration and repairs. Hopefully reopening again in the spring.

<u>Grizedale Hall Lodge</u> – Repairs ongoing to open again for rental. Staff will be offered the property first and if no staff take on the tenancy it will be opened to the public.

<u>High Barn</u> – This is on the list for renovation but is not currently a priority.

The Kennels is having work carried out to make it available for the wildlife ranger currently living in Fern Cottage. Fern Cottage for rent.

Forest Update – Planting is currently underway as a priority to replace the number of trees lost to Storm Arwen. There will be some harvesting work carried out, but this will be focused at the top end of the forest/

Alison will find out if the Highways or Forestry England are responsible for the culvert flooding at Bowkerstead double gates.

Mark Holroyd Head of Recreation and Public Affairs has met with the heads of the new Council and raised concerns about road closures. Alison is reporting any sightings of illegal motorbikes accessing the forest, to the Police. Planning Application Submitted by Satterthwaite Parish Council for Proposed Car Park in the land behind the Church.

The 20mph application – We have had to start this process again, but we are discussing with Highways as the village should be a priority with the amount of traffic coming through.

We will continue to contact Highways about reinstating the white lines at the junction beside the Church.

Some residents want double yellow lines beside the Church and along part of Church Lane. The Parish Council has been informed that, double yellow lines are very expensive for councils to implement and that we should be considering a single white line option. If this is taken forward it is with a full consultation with the community. We are hoping to hold a Parish event early in the

#### CHURCH NEWS

#### Dear Friends.

The story starts with an Emperor and a governor, and an international decree that everyone has to change their plans. "All went to their home towns." The decree did not care that a teenager was pregnant. Decrees of this kind do not have eyes or ears or hearts, they do not have compassion or hope. There was an emperor and a governor and a decree. Powerful men doing things, a familiar story.

But then something astonishing happens in our story. Nowadays, we may not realise it is astonishing, but it is. Before the Victorian novel nobody wrote about people who were not powerful or notable. But here is a name, a name of an ordinary person, Joseph. And then another name, another ordinary person, Mary. Then ordinary scruffy shepherds turn up. The wise men went to the local king as they assumed it must be somewhere of political or religious significance... but no, it appears God wanted to enter our world in an ordinary domestic setting.

At the centre of the story is a baby. Again, a surprise. Babies were not worth writing about in ancient literature- too common, too ordinary. Babies cannot use force to get what they want. They cannot elicit commands like Roman Emperors that multiple countries will follow. Babies require kindness to survive. They entice us to soften our voices and care for them. God's first gift for humanity was not to do something for us, but to have big eyes that entice humanity to coo and stroke hair and play peekaboo. God comes to us today as God did 2000 years ago, not from a position of religious or political strength but in the ordinary places of our lives, our places of work, our homes. Christ comes not as a decree but as a person, not as a powerful leader but with childlike hands held out. Even if you impossibly have got everything sorted, and have no worries, no frailties, no pain, no vulnerability, this story is still for you. It is just a little distant maybe, like it is in translation. But to you who have uncertainties and worries and pain...

Blessed are you for to you is born a Saviour. And this shall be the sign. He will be found wrapped in swaddling clothes and placed with you, even if you feel those living arrangements are less than ideal. John

#### ROOKHOW NEWS

ROOKHOW SUPPORTS VULNERABLE GROUPS We have recently allocated over £8,000 to 12 community groups for subsidised stays at Rookhow in the 6th Round of its Retreat Away Fund for vulnerable groups. The groups include refugees, domestic abuse support, drug and alcohol addiction recovery, rape and sexual exploitation support, workshops for young black people and activities for families from deprived communities. Individuals report huge benefits from having time away in nature away from the stresses of daily life. They find Rookhow a safe place of simple calm and beauty. Rookhow puts 5% of its booking income into the fund and local Quaker Meetings, visitors and guests support it too.
