CITIZENS ADVICE

Be alert for scams - they are on the increase! These are the top five to look out for:

- Fake texts and emails, known as 'friend-inneed scams' - these are messages from unknown numbers claiming to be from your relatives/children, asking you for money. Be suspicious! It is okay to take your time. Try to contact them directly on a known number.

 Only consider the request if you are 100% sure it is genuine.
- 2. Home Improvement scams if you're being pressured to pay upfront for work, or the company adds on additional costs before completing the work, it might be a scam. Research the company first, do not be rushed, and get a written agreement of the work before it starts. Pay by card, which gives you greater protection.
- 3. Online shopping scams watch out for fake adverts. If it looks too good to be true, it may well be! Protect yourself by reading reviews from different websites, find the company's details on the Companies House website, check their terms and conditions, and pay by card.
- 4. Used car scams when buying a car, avoid scammers by using an established firm with a good reputation. Check the car's history. Inspect the car and take a test drive. Avoid buying at auction or online you have less protection.
- 5. Financial scams if you are contacted for an investment opportunity unexpectedly online it could be a scam. Get advice from a trusted source and do not be rushed into making any quick decisions. Dear Friends.

Imagine eternity from God's point of view. I know that is a difficult thing to ask. You may not believe in God, or if you do it seems like such an audacious thing to do, to imagine being God. But give it a go. Your whole being is love because God is love. But that love had nowhere to go. So God creates the universe. But God has still got more love to give. So God creates life, and makes humanity, makes us. But God has got yet more love to give. So God comes among us as a tiny baby. The Word, which was with God and was God becomes flesh. Christmas is when we find out why the universe was created. Because at Christmas we discover the universe was created for us to be the place where God's love could go. One thing that I often hear around this time of year is 'Don't you think Christmas has got too materialistic?' I think, as an ordained person I am meant to be quite cross about it. However, if we take the word 'materialistic' literally, over -literally perhaps, we can say that Christmas is and ought to be completely materialistic. Christmas is the celebration that God became material. God was wrapped in the material of swaddling clothes when Jesus was laid in a manger. It does not get any more material than that. Christmas is about materialism. That is exactly what we are celebrating. Christmas is about God becoming part of the material world in Jesus. And the word has more to give. The word matter meaning stuff comes from the same root as the word matter meaning important, as in that really matters. Our world matters. Our world is made from God's love, which means that somehow all the evil and death- and there is plenty of that right now- all the evil and death in the world cannot have the final word. At Christmas God is speaking to each one of us, as gently, unthreateningly, passionately and disarmingly as we can possibly imagine. And what God is saying, through taking the material of our life, are the words that matter more than any we will ever hear: 'You matter. You matter right now. You matter to me. You matter forever.' Please do join us to celebrate this at our Christmas services. John
