DALE PARK RAINFALL

October rainfall was10.69" with 3 dry days and November to 24th, 10.21" with 2 dry days. The last two months have produced nearly 2 feet of rain. Last year's figures - October 18.1", 7 dry days and November, to 24th only 4" and 7 dry days again. Last year's total rainfall including November was 63" and this year the same period is 66"

SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS
Over the summer and the October school
holidays we have carried out speed surveys
through the village. The average speed was
29.1mph with the fastest speed being 67mph!
This has given us the evidence to move forward
with applying for a 20mph speed limit through
the village.

Also, on the subject of roads, Gary met with a representative from Highways. They have agreed with the Parish Council regarding the state of the roads. They have said the whole road will be top dressed and all gullies cleaned and repaired. The poor repairs will be re-done with the proper camber.

The Highways are also changing the policy on the road closure signage, so they will be more co-ordinated with neighbouring parishes. The road down through the valley is also going to be treated as a road that cannot be closed due to it being the only access road into the village. The Parish Council will be pushing on with the plans for the car park as it has been on the back burner for a while. We will contact ENWL to discuss moving the electricity pole.

The Eagle's Head has been designated as a warm space for people to go and sit for a few hours to keep warm. We will apply for a small grant of £1000 for this but there is also a larger grant available which will possibly pay for solar panels and batteries which will be ideal during power cuts.

CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends.

At Christmas we are so used to the image of the baby Jesus, that we forget what an extraordinary thing that is. You can't get more vulnerable than a new born human baby. We've seen them. They won't be able to walk for another year. Talking and feeding themselves will take another couple of years. And they don't become financially independent until they are in their fifties.

I suspect that God doesn't have to fill out risk-assessment forms, but if he did it should have made him think twice about this plan.

This is the unique wonder of Christianity. God's desire to be our companion was so deep that it involved coming among us as a human being. It meant growing up in a carpenter's home, sharing our human drama, facing the challenges of life, and eventually enduring betrayal and the agony of death in Jerusalem.

But at Christmas we concentrate on the first part of that: being a tiny, defenceless baby. If Jesus were simply a superhuman hero, why would he need to undergo the trauma of birth at all? You'd think he could just show up in Galilee, fully grown, good to go. But God becomes flesh as the most vulnerable little person imaginable, at the mercy of inexperienced parents, clumsy animals and hostile rulers.

What if this is what God really looks like? What if God is so longing to be in relationship with us, that the central image of that relationship is of God yearning to be embraced by us, made warm by us, cradled by us? In some ways we'd prefer the superman Jesus. But it's time once again to discover the real Christmas. God risks absolutely everything to be cradled in our arms. God is entrusted to us. Big enough to make the whole universe. Small enough to fit in our embrace. That's the wonder of Christmas.
