COUNTING THE BIRDS THAT ARE COUNTING ON YOU It will be all eyes to the skies on Saturday, 25th and Sunday, 26th January 2014, as the nation takes part in the RSPB's annual Big Garden Birdwatch. The activity is the biggest garden wildlife survey in the world and last year almost 600,000 people counted the birds in their garden. Big Garden Birdwatch, which has been running for 35 years, provides the RSPB with masses of information about changes in numbers of garden birds in winter, and helps to alert conservationists to significant declines in UK garden species such as house sparrows and starlings.

This year, for the first time, we need you to log some of the other wildlife you see in your garden too. We want to know whether you ever see deer, squirrels, badgers, hedgehogs, frogs and toads in your gardens, to help build an overall picture of how important our gardens are for giving all types of wildlife a home.

To take part, spend just one hour at any time over the Big Garden Birdwatch weekend noting the highest number of each species seen in your garden or local outside space at any one time. Then simply submit your results to the RSPB, either online at www.rspb.org.uk/birdwatch or in the post.

LETTING AGENTS - KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

With a shortage of affordable or social housing across South Lakeland many people have no choice but to find accommodation in the private rented sector. Citizens Advice across the country helps many people to sort out problems with their Landlords and we also lobby Government for improvements.

From 1 November 2013, letting agencies must provide information in their advertisements, in print and on their websites, on what fees they charge. This new Advertising Standards Authority (ASA) requirement does not stop agencies charging excessively high fees – but it does mean they have to tell you about them, clearly and upfront.

Our colleagues at Shelter have produced an online tool to help enforce the new requirements. You can use it to tell Shelter every time you come across fees that have not been advertised and they will pass the information on to the ASA to take action, just use this link:

http://england.shelter.org.uk/campaigns/fixing_private_renting/letting_agencies/ report_hidden_letting_fees Please note that this does not apply to adverts listed on property portal sites such as Rightmove, Zoopla and Primelocation, as they are exempt from the new requirement.

A new consumer redress scheme is also being developed, a draft was issued by Government in November, and we hope that the scheme will soon be implemented. www.cumbriaruralcab.org.uk.


COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Highways: Your Chairman and Clerk attended a Highways 'Meet and greet' event at the Barrow depot in December. We received an update on the status of County Highways from the new Area Engineer, Nick Raymond, and we also met with our 'Better Highways' Area team. Highways is still undergoing major restructuring, suffering resource cuts and understaffing, pending recruitment. It was fully acknowledged that during this time, work had been very reactive, mainly responding to hotline reports, as opposed to maintenance schedules or the list of issues drawn up by Parish Councils. We (and others) expressed our strong concern about the false economy of not clearing drains or cutting back verges, resulting in costly damage to the road surface. We were reassured that once the structures and staff were in place, we would see a return to more Area Team visits and maintenance work. Lengthsman: Meanwhile, our Lengthsman, Archie Workman continues to do great works on Colton's drains and verges. Contact the Clerk if you would like him to visit your patch. If you are able to check your local roadside drains and simply clear off the leaves with your boot, that can be a great help, and is immensely satisfying to see the water gurgle away (OK - perhaps your Clerk should get out more!). Archie has produced a 2014 'Lengthsman's Calendar'! - take a look at the website for some of the images from it - it includes the 'Rusland Slug'! Broadband: Mike Postle continues to work hard on our behalves to try to ensure that Colton gets the best possible outcome from the 'Connecting Cumbria' project. We have been told that 70% of Colton's properties should get super-fast broadband sometime in 2015. The remaining properties are promised speeds of somewhere between 2mb/s and 24mb/s. There are ways in which the Parish Council may be able to help enable more properties to be connected to super-fast broadband. Watch this space and see Mike's blog at:

The phone rang and I answered it, only to be put on my guard immediately by that characteristic pause that indicates a foreign call centre.

'Could I speak with Mr Dixon, please?' The man had a strong Indian accent.

'Speaking,' I replied without enthusiasm.

'Hello Mr Dixon. My name is Ethelred'.

Well, this took me completely by surprise and I found it very funny indeed. So much so that I felt it necessary to apologise to Ethelred for laughing so much. I found myself saying that I was so sorry- it was just that I wasn't ready for that. The call ended with me having no idea what Ethelred was trying to sell me.

I reflected afterwards that I had spoken with a real human being in a real place, with real feelings and needs, pleasures and pains. Perhaps he was struggling as best he could to feed his family, and this rubbish and thankless job telephoning strangers was something of a lifeline. Or perhaps he was being abused horribly by his employers as well as by the people he was calling. I'll never know.

Anyway, Ethelred, who was unready for the reaction his name caused, featured in my prayers that day.

LOCAL CHURCHES CELEBRATE CHRISTMAS IN STYLE

The best attendances for many years were recorded at both Rusland and Satterthwaite churches in the Christmas period. It was Rusland's turn to host the Carol Service and over 90 people were in the congregation singing lustily, with Paul Gregson at the organ. Helen Adams was the narrator of the Christmas story and several people made individual contributions of readings or music. Tea, coffee and cakes were served at the end of the afternoon. Carols Round the Tree took place in All Saints' church, Satterthwaite on Christmas Eve when it was estimated that around 100 people were present. The organ was played by Harry Elkington Crabtree and a collection was made for the Childrens' Society, which raised £81

St. Paul's Church, Rusland had 60 in the congregation on Christmas morning, the organist being Elizabeth Clegg and All Saints' Church, Satterthwaite had 49, where Joan Pollock played the organ. At both services the celebrant was the Reverend John Dixon.

The Sunday immediately after Christmas saw a Joint Benefice Service held at All Saints' Church, Satterthwaite when worshippers from Hawkshead, Sawrey and Rusland joined with those from Satterthwaite.
