FUNDING ON THE HORIZON AT LAST

The Rusland Valley and Fells Landscape Partnership is delighted to be able to confirm that it has been successful in its bid to the Heritage Lottery Fund for the sum of £1.3M which will provide much of the funding for the Rusland Horizons scheme. Additional partnership funding is also in place for the first year.

The Steering Group will begin the process of recruiting staff in February and 15 projects will be launched at intervals during 2016. These carefully planned projects cover aspects of traditional skills, landscape and wildlife, local history, archaeology and access. We will be recruiting up to 12 apprentices to help with the work and to learn a range of land management and conservation skills. The scheme runs for three years but we will also be planning a legacy programme to continue what Rusland Horizons is starting.

There are many opportunities for local people to become involved including volunteering their skills, stories and knowledge, learning about the landscape and just enjoying taking part in a range of events. It has taken a lot of hard work and commitment to get to this stage; it will be rewarding to see the aspirations of local people, who came up with the ideas over five years ago, finally come to fruition.

Gritting Machine – The acquisition of a gritting machine was discussed.

Car Parking Plan – The Council members have agreed to meet in the area being discussed as a possible car park at their earliest convenience, to look at the site in more detail and check on the dimensions, with regards to spaces and access.

Broadband – As yet the fibre optic broadband has not been connected but it has been said it should be all up and running by March.

Moor Lane is being used increasingly by motorbikes and it was suggested that a gate at the bottom would deter the bikes from using this lane. We will write to Lake District National Park regarding this, asking if a gate can be placed at the bottom of the lane preventing the motorbikes from accessing this route.

The Parish Statement for the Satterthwaite Parish is in need to people to come forward and help with the issues arising in the plan. Without anyone coming forward the plan cannot be acted upon and therefore we may lose out on funding which is available for the various projects. RAINFALL

I have kept records of rainfall in Dale Park since 2003, and 2015 was heading up for a dry year with 131 dry days and rainfall of 58.94". Then the rain started and November and December's rainfall totalled 34.59", with 5 dry days in November and none in December. There were 11 days in those two months where the rainfall exceeded an inch, with 14th November recording 3.2". December's rainfall of 19.6" was a monthly record, beating the previous record of 17.6" in November 2009 when Satterthwaite village was flooded. It will be noted from the figures below that 2010 was the driest year (52.85") with the December rainfall that year only 1.99".

COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

December Floods: Although most of Colton Parish escaped the worst of the recent flooding, some properties and businesses in Finthswaite and Lakeside were unfortunately inundated, either from the lake or from fell-side water. The Parish Council has expressed its sympathies and sent those affected information and advice from County and District Councils: links are also on the website.

In terms of the roads, County Highways of course have their hands full with the aftermath of the flooding, and your Clerk has been holding back from bothering them for a while. However, even before Storm Desmond, the rains and high tides turned Bouth causeway into a lake, with the water deep enough to cover the top of the hedges. Despite many calls to County Highways, the road was not closed for 3 days, during which time two cars drove into the floods, resulting in fire engines, police, ambulances and other rescue teams being called out. The Parish Council wrote to County lamenting the waste of resources, which could have been prevented had the road been closed earlier, and asking how the local community could help with early alerts for closing the causeway in future.

Our roads in general are awash with water and debris. Maintenance of our roadside drains have been neglected by County Highways for a long time, with many now so overgrown by the verge that they cannot operate. Archie, our Lengthsman has been working extremely hard in all parts of the Parish to get some of the badly blocked drains running again. He is buying some even longer drain rods!

Green Roads: Some of you will have noticed that Pegg Lane, between Oxen Park and Ickenthwaite, is almost impassable on foot, even wearing wellies. Meanwhile, recreational off-roading groups continue to use these lanes (which they are legally allowed to do), making the situation much worse. Our Chairman has been attempting for at least two years to arrange a meeting with Highways about the status of these lanes.

CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends

Lent will be starting soon (this year on 10th February). A few years ago the Church of England had a relatively low-key campaign called 'Lent Lite', which was low-key enough to pass me by. Apparently, at the time, a Church of England spokesman said: 'Traditionally Lent has been seen as a sombre time of sackcloth and ashes. What we are suggesting is that people share jokes, which is a way of kick starting a very positive take on the season'. I discover that that this did spark a bit of a debate. Some people were all in favour, rightly pointing out that our faith is one of joy, celebration and hope. Others were rather less enthusiastic, rightly pointing out that Lent is a time for taking our faith seriously.

Unfortunately some people seem to believe that Christian discipline is completely incompatible with humour, which is sad. I am pleased to report, though, that church life is full of humour, and at least some of it is deliberate. Laughter is one of the most precious gifts that we have.

And perhaps it can help us look more objectively at ourselves. One of the problems with Lent is that often it is used as an excuse to diet or not diet, to take more exercise or less exercise. In other words it is used to focus attention on ourselves and it can become a kind of inverted luxury, a way of pampering ourselves, another way of putting me first. This is not the point of Lent. In fact it is the opposite of the point.

Perhaps a good laugh may help us see beyond the narrow limits of our own lives.
