NEW YEAR, NEW CHALLENGES

LOCAL COMMUNITY COMES TOGETHER TO ENSURE FUTURE OF SHOW

The future of the Rusland Show looks to be safe. A community effort to bid for the Show field at auction has been successful, thanks to a consortium bid by the Rusland Valley Horticultural Society and the Rusland Valley Community Trust. Many local people also contributed interest-free loans to allow a credible bid to be put together.

The Show field was part of a lot at the recent auction of lckenthwaite Farm, following the death of Mr Joe Jackson.

The Rusland Valley Horticultural Show has been running for 127 years and for most of that time, the show has been held on Whitestock Meadow. Mr Jackson had kindly allowed the show to take place on the same field for many years but local people were worried that new owners might not be so accommodating.

The show which takes place on the third Saturday of August is renowned for its traditional, non-commercial character and is enjoyed by several hundred local people and visitors.

Antony Meanwell, Secretary of the Show Committee, was delighted and said "It is fantastic to know that the show is guaranteed for the future and that the young people of the valley will have the chance to enjoy this great local occasion for years to come".

COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS


Following intensive lobbying by your Parish and County Councillors, we are very pleased to hear that a temporary footbridge is to be installed this month at Bouthrey Bridge over the River Crake between Nibthwaite and Water Yeat, strong enough to support a farm quad-bike and trailer. Work to restore the bridge itself will begin in June next year.

Following the news that the government is considering the large-scale sale of Forestry Commission woodland, we invited a member of FC staff, Mr David Lowe, to speak at our meeting on 10th Jan. The government is due to announce its review on 24th Jan, following which there is expected to be a consultation period. You may be aware of local concern over the Forestry Commission's sale of Rigg Wood in Colton Parish on the east shore of Coniston. Despite Rigg Wood being dedicated CROW access land for walkers, it has now been fenced with padlocked gates. Unfortunately, it seems that the legislation does not require the owner to provide for access. This has now drawn national interest, as it appears to illustrate one possible consequence of the sale of our woodlands. The Parish Council has expressed its concern, and has written to the local MP, Tim Farron, and to Jim Paice MP, Minister of State for Defra. A local website has been set up by a Satterthwaite-based community group which gives latest news and contact information if you wish to express your own opinion - see www.savelakelandsforests.org.uk . A meeting to consult local councils about governance arrangements for the National Park was attended by Cllrs Colin Barr and Vanessa Champion in December. The principle outcome was a preference to increase local representation at the expense of county or national appointees.

The next Council meeting is to be held on Monday 21st Feb, Finsthwaite Village Hall, 7:30pm. All welcome, as ever.

RUSLAND AND DISTRICT WI

After long deliberation Rusland & District W.I. decided to cancel their Carol Evening on 14th December, due to weather and road conditions. Almost immediately the snow melted and temperatures rose above freezing. Joan and Elizabeth, who had been training the choir, decided that the show must go on and they produced a lovely evening of carols to sing, items by the WI choir, festive readings and the Benefice Junior Choir. Thanks go to them for all their hard work. The event raised over £200 for the Duddon & Furness Mountain Rescue team, which had been the chosen charity of the W.I. The next meeting of the WI will be on 18th January in Satterthwaite Parish Room when Ron Mein will speak on Pack Horse Trails. The competition is a "Horse in any medium," and new members will be most welcome at the start of a new year.



SATTERTHWAITE HYDRO UPDATE

Apologies for a long silence but we have had some drawn out dialogue with the grant awarding body. We are however now in a position to provide you with an update. Back in September we were informed that we had been offered a 100% grant but that they wanted to impose certain terms and conditions. When we received written information the terms and conditions imposed offered less than a 100% grant. We successfully negotiated the removal of this clause only to then have further requirements placed upon us at the last minute. As you know one of the vital components to our revenue stream was the ability to receive Feed in Tariff payments and you will recall that there was (and still is) considerable confusion about these. We have tried to clarify this position but it is just about impossible to get someone to provide us with a definitive position regarding our potential eligibility. In the absence of such information we have to assume that the information we have received is correct - meaning that our project would not be eligible to receive these payments.

The fact that our revenue stream will be drastically reduced means that we have been unable to satisfactorily agree the grant terms and conditions without raising the risk profile to a high level. Consequently the grant offer has been withdrawn.

This means we cannot progress the project further in its current format. We have begun looking for alternative funding methods, but we suspect this is unlikely to be quick!

Whilst the project team is obviously disappointed that the large amount of work has so far not provided a successful outcome we feel it is important to highlight that we have shown that the project is technically feasible. It is the funding climate which is making things difficult. Feed in tariffs are new and the people who are supposed to be implementing them appear to not have been told how they will work. The bodies they work for are also under threat from the spending cuts. Add to this that the availability of finance is not exactly plentiful and you will understand our problems.

Let's hope we can find another way of making it work. We will of course keep you informed as and when we have anything meaningful to report.

Dear Friends,

The other day I received a free pen through the post. This particular pen did have something written on it in the way that such pens do, but this particular pen had St Paul's,Rusland written on the side. It appeared to be advertising our church in Rusland. In fact though, it was advertising itself. I could if I so wished have ordered a whole lot of them. I didn't so wish- they were quite expensive and the minimum order was 1000. Also, the company who made the pens had sent a standard letter much of which didn't quite apply in our case- the language used revealed that they were not just targeting churches. The pens, I read, were to be used to reward our loyal customers. We could send them to shareholders. They would help our 'organisation' establish a foothold in the market place.

Some things the letter said (it was quite a long letter) did make a little more sense in our case. The pens apparently would show that our organisation valued each and every 'customer', that we recognised that all our 'customers' were individuals, and we cared about them. They weren't just part of the 'customer base'. It went on like this quite a bit, emphasising the importance of the individual. To some extent this applies to us. Of course, we are all individuals. Everybody who comes to our churches, or who reads this magazine is uniquely different. We celebrate that, we enjoy our differences, we aim to be a tolerant and accepting church community, welcoming people whoever they are, and whatever their background.

But we are more than just individuals, we are also part of a community. I think we ought to distrust the rank individualism of our age. We do have individual 'rights' but, as our Gospel makes plain, we also have duties to our neighbours. Our God values us as individuals but knows that we are also part of a society, a society that gives us immense privileges but also responsibilities.
