# TIME FOR A FRESH START!

GIVE YOUR VIEWS ON CUMBRIA COUNTY COUNCIL'S

DRAFT BUDGET

At Cumbria County Council we are once again assessing how we can best spend the money we have available to us, in order to provide the best possible services to our residents.

Last year we had to reduce our budget by £44 million as a result of national budget cuts. We carefully reviewed all of our services, re-engineered the council and made big changes.

Now we again have to make further savings for 2012/13. Thankfully because of the decisions we made last year the amount still to find is a comparatively modest £2.8 million.

Once again we are keen to hear your views about how we should make these savings: How can we minimise the effects of having considerably less money? We have put together some proposals to save money, which you can give your views on now.

There you will find detailed information; details of public events you can attend; online surveys; and an online discussion forum you can take part in. If you wish to get involved please ensure you have your say before this consultation ends on 31 January 2012.



Grit Bins: You may have noticed than we now have more grit bins in the Parish. Three have been bought by the Parish Council, and others provided by County. Some have, however, been placed in unexpected locations, and some are as yet unfilled, so we will be 'taking stock' at our next meeting!

Field of Pigs, between Ealinghearth and Finsthwaite: We are very aware that the flooding here arising from the 'pig field' is worse than ever as is the slurry pollution into the becks. We are pressing hard for a resolution and are awaiting developments from the Environment Agency. We understand that Highways are unable to deal with the flooding until the pollution problem is resolved. Along with Haverthwaite Parish, we are also trying to resolve the issue of pigs escaping into the surrounding woodland. #### WORKERS WATCH OUT!

The Government is working on plans to reform Employment law, and some of these could come into effect as soon as April 2012 if the Parliamentary timetable goes to plan. CABs across the country are worried about many of the possible changes. If you have a problem at work then get advice before April to make sure you qualify under the current rules. So what are these proposed changes?

- At present, workers only get protection against unfair dismissal after they have been in their job for 12 months. This will increase to two years. CAB estimate that this will make the jobs of three million workers even more insecure than they are already.
- Amongst the changes to the Employment Tribunal process, claimants will face increased application fees, witness expenses will be abolished, a big increase in awarded costs for those losing claims, and judges will sit alone in making decisions.

The CAB view is that these changes will create a substantial barrier to justice for low-paid workers needing to defend their rights. Meanwhile, there are no proposals to help people get the money they are due from winning their employment tribunal case.

The Government has said that it will explore options for a quicker, cheaper alternative system for more straightforward claims, but so far there is no indication of what this might be, with April just weeks away.

#### **CHURCH NEWS**

#### Dear Friends.

A few years ago we visited Bristol Zoo. I think I remember the very pleasant car park attendant with his ticket machine, who used to work there, so I was very amused to hear the story about him.

The car park outside Bristol Zoo has space for 150 cars and 8 coaches. Using his ticket machine the attendant charged £1 for cars and £5 for coaches. He had worked there for 25 years, and then one day he didn't turn up for work.

Bristol Zoo Management phoned up the City Council to get them to send a new parking attendant.

'But', said the Council, 'that car park is your responsibility...'

'No', said Bristol Zoo Management, 'the attendant was employed by the City Council, wasn't he...?'

'What attendant?' asked the Council.

While I find this story amusing, obviously for professional reasons I can't condone this type of behaviour. That would be irresponsible. As a Christian I believe that just taking what we do not deserve is wrong. Isn't it? Well, usually it is, but not always. Obviously this man was wrong: even though his entrepreneurial actions may bring a smile to our lips, ultimately he was a dishonest conman. But as a Christian I believe there are some things we can take, which we do not deserve- not car park money but God's love for us, of course.

Although dated and theologically unfashionable (even my spell-checker suggests I change his name to 'toilet'!), I very much like the words of Paul Tillich:

'It is as though a voice were saying: You are accepted. You are accepted by that which is greater than you, and the name of which you do not know. Do not ask for the name now; perhaps later you will find it. Do not try to do anything now; perhaps later you will do much. Do not seek anything; do not perform anything; do not intend anything. Simply accept the fact that you are accepted!'
