The following day saw members taking afternoon tea at the Rothay Manor Hotel – an annual indulgence – where a very good time and lovely food was enjoyed by all.



Dear Friends

On the door of the porch at Beckside Cottage is a sticker: 'Quilters are Piecemakers'. She was certainly that too. Thelma will be missed by all who had the privilege of meeting and knowing her.
