HAPPENINGS IN THE FOREST

There are a variety of outdoor activities during June to enthuse youngsters of all ages about the flora and fauna of the forest. These include a walking safari (Sunday 4th), Badger watching (Wednesday 7th, evening), den building for dads (Sunday 18th), discovering creepy crawlies (Sunday 25th). NATURAL ENVIRONMENT AND RURAL COMMUNITIES (NERC) ACT 2006 - Green Road Driving

Restrictions to mechanically propelled vehicles on rights of way.

As from 2 May 2006 there are 31 dual status routes in the Park that have had rights of use for mechanically propelled vehicles extinguished. Dual status routes are those that are both unclassified county roads (UCRS) and public rights of way, either footpaths or bridleways.

The routes affected in the Colton and Satterthwaite areas are as follows

Public bridleway 566030 - Grizedale Centre across to Lane Head, Coniston

Public bridleway 566031 - Grizedale Centre to High Parkamoor

Public bridleway 566032 - Moor Lane, Satterthwaite to Parkamoor

Public bridleway 566034 - Low Bowkerstead to Force Forge

4 x 4's and motor cycles are now illegal on these routes. The Police are responsible for enforcement. Other UCRs in the area remain unaffected by the NERC Act.



SATTERTHWAITE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING The annual meeting took place on 15th May with a good but not large attendance. As usual presentations were made by all of the local interest groups and official bodies. Our thanks to all those who made presentations. There were, sadly, no representatives from the local and district councils probably as Colton had its annual meeting on the same night. We might try to avoid that next year. Notable among the presentations this year was the presentation from Alan Wilson on behalf of Satterthwaite School - sadly, the last he will give as the school closes this year. We should like to use this column to say a big thank you to Alan and all of his staff and sundry helpers who have given us a school (and children) to be proud of over the last few years and to wish them all a happy last term. Also notable was a presentation from Tony Hill and Dave Robinson of the LDNPA, which focused on new legislation from 2nd May which now outlaws 4x4 and Trail bike riding on certain "green lanes". Quite complex but as far as Grizedale is concerned only one legal route now exists for these users, and that is the Grizedale centre to Esthwaite route (via the Stone Fox). Signage will follow in time.

SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS A short council meeting followed the Annual Parish meeting. Officers were elected for the coming year, and a number of accounts paid. A decision was taken to follow up concerns over unlicensed operations by Go-Ape outside of their summer opening hours. Discussion on a parish website and parish notice boards was proposed for our next meeting which will be on Monday 3rd July.

COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The government's new Natural Environment and Rural Communities Act 2006 - Green Road Driving came into force last month. Colton Parish has eight green roads within its boundary, only one of which will have vehicular rights extinguished on part of its length. On the section from the Parish boundary to High Parkamoor of the Grizedale to High Parkamoor road only bridleway rights will remain. The section from High Parkamoor to High Nibthwaite is a UCR (unclassified county road) and the presumed vehicular rights will remain. The routes that remain open are Moss Wood, Thwaite Moss, Old Hall Lane Bouth, Hulleter, Ickenthwaite and Oxen Park to Ickenthwaite. Rusland Pool will remain open to recreational vehicles and seasonal Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) for the purposes of fisheries conservation will continue. Any inappropriate use of these roads should be reported to Tony Hill our LDNPA ranger on 015394 46892. The next parish council meeting is on 10th July at Finsthwaite Village Hall at 7.30pm. All welcome.


