# MIDSUMMER MADNESS?

#### **WOODLAND INDUSTRY REVIVAL**

Tony Hill our LDNP Ranger writes: -

Stony Hazel Woods are owned and managed by us and in recent years we have been doing a lot of practical work, to return part of the woods to coppice rotation. By enclosing the northern section of the woods with deer fencing, installed by a local contractor, we are now able to commence a cycle of coppice management.

We have what is perhaps a unique situation, of having three separate charcoal burners operating in the same wood simultaneously. This may be the first time in many, many years that this has occurred in the Furness Fells.

In addition to charcoal production, wood for swill basket making, hurdles and furniture is also utilised by local craft persons.

I would encourage you to take a walk into the woods, if you have not already done so, to see the work for yourself. Enter the woods using the public footpath from Rusland Church in the south, or Force Forge at the northern end. Brewer Wood is in the area of grid reference SD 335/904.

# RUSLAND MOSS NATIONAL NATURE RESERVE SD335/885 - The Rusland Valley Mosses

This year we are extending the boardwalks on the public footpaths throughout the Mosses, to improve access on the site, particularly when it is wet and/or during high tides. We are also installing a viewing platform, so the public can view the central dome on Rusland Moss, a highly attractive and atmospheric landscape, where both Red and Roe deer can be seen throughout the year.

Also, don't forget about the new opportunities for walks across the Heights from the Rusland Valley. They are well signposted and waymarked throughout. The Greenwood Trail leaflet, highlights some of the suggested routes.



SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS
A very quick Council meeting after the Annual Parish
Meeting saw Mr P Townsend and Mr T Gill re-elected
as Chairman and Vice Chairman respectively. The
end of year financial report was received and
approved and the Annual Return was completed.
At a second meeting on the 22nd May the Council
considered the demand for a 30mph speed limit
through the village to be commissioned concurrently
with the one at Grizedale. This initiative follows
some specific complaints from villagers and after a
short discussion, Councillors were unanimously in
favour.

There was also a short discussion on developments at Stricely which had been brought to the Council's attention. In the event, Mr David Spedding, one of the owners of the site, was present and had a letter from the LDNPA enforcement officer who confirmed that developments were in order and no breach of planning laws had been made. The Council took the opportunity to stress to David Spedding the special nature of the site and the ongoing concern, which Parishioners had for this area. At present it is believed there are no immediate concerns. Next meeting Monday 9<sup>th</sup> July at 7.30pm.

#### Church News

#### Dear Friends.

I have a friend who is a vicar in Birmingham. In fact he is actually vicar of Spaghetti Junction (that is not the proper name of the parish, but it is accurate). He and I must have two of the most contrasting places of work in the Church of England.

As summer approaches and the roads get busier, perhaps Hawkshead will come to feel, to hassled locals, a bit more like Spaghetti Junction, but I don't think my friend would recognise it as such.

Although the pace of life is slower here than it is in other parts of the country, we still get frustrated by delays and little inconveniences, at least I do. Even here, we find ourselves rushing from one thing to another. While it is undeniably frustrating to be delayed, we need to remember that pausing is often a good thing to do. It is good to stop the rushing, the constant doing, and relish a moment or two of quietness. Quietness is even more important than ever in our loud and fast lives. We need silence. We need to learn what silence is. We need silence to make sense of the words we use and to make room for the unspoken. And we will find that silence is often more eloquent than speech because it is deeper and more complete.

The vicar of Spaghetti Junction is much better at finding and using silence than I am, which only serves to remind me how privileged we are to live in a place where silence comes on tap.
