
Proceeds from the registration will be for the benefit of the churches. Walkers may like to use the event to raise money for other good causes which they support.

#### **CHURCH NEWS**

Dear Friends.

We are comfortable with the image of gentle Jesus, meek and mild. But perhaps it is not quite right. Whether we choose to follow him or not, we can accept that Jesus was rather more radical and dangerous than we sometimes like to think.

He could have stayed at home with his trade and family, his village synagogue and familiar friends. Instead he left home and became like a wandering minstrel, singing a new song that many "safe" people did not want to hear. He gathered disciples; not the outstanding citizens of respect and great influence, but ordinary working people. He associated with undesirable characters: Aliens like a Roman army officer; despised tax collectors, Samaritan women, a Phoenician woman; he allowed a woman to weep at his feet and then wipe them with her hair. He touched lepers, and let an 'unclean' woman to touch him; he did things on the Sabbath that were not considered proper; he spent time in a cemetery with a raving lunatic. He told radical stories, challenged the accepted wisdom of Moses, and single handed caused havoc among the traders in the temple court.

All sounds a bit too dangerous to be entirely comfortable. But then maybe following Jesus is not meant to be comfortable.

REMEMBER TO RENEW YOUR TAX CREDITS! If you claim Tax Credits, then every year you must renew your claim by checking and signing a statement sent to you by HMRC and sending it back by 31 July. Last year more than 1/2 million households didn't renew and so their Tax Credits were stopped. Even worse it can trigger a letter from HMRC called a 'notice of overpayment' and this can mean you have to pay back some of the Tax Credits you have already had (and spent). At the CAB we often help people sort out their Tax Credit muddle, but it can take a long time. Everyone claiming Tax Credits has to renew, even when nothing has changed in your circumstances, you do not want to claim anymore or you do not think you are eligible to continue receiving them. You can renew anytime from mid April until end July. HMRC have produced a help sheet about the renewal process. It is available from their website at www.hmrc.gov.uk. Look out for the TV, radio and press adverts from HMRC called 'Get it Right First Time'.

If you don't currently claim Tax Credits, you can check if you are eligible using a short questionnaire on the HMRC website at

http://taxcredits.hmrc.gov.uk/Qualify/DIQHousehold.as px or ask your local CAB to do a benefit check for you. Free, confidential advice and help is available on any aspect of this article as well as debt, benefits, employment, and any other problems. #### **COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

We are very pleased to have appointed a new Lengthsman: Tony Atkinson, from Riddingside Farm, Colton. Tony will be starting work soon, for 2 days per month. Please forward any requests for work (cutting back verges at junctions, clearing drains, cleaning signs, etc.) to ClIr Ian Cunliffe, the Lengthsman liaison officer, on 01229 861440. Ian does not possess a computer (wise man!), so the alternative method is on paper to Springfield Cottage, Springfield, Colton, Ulverston, LA12 8HE.

The Forestry Commission have contacted us about Old Hall Wood, Bouth with a proposal to increase community involvement in its management. The current 'design plan' for the wood (see http://www.forestry.gov.uk/forestry/INFD-8FTFXZ) allows some flexibility for example in selecting areas for coppicing, opening up views, improving paths, and improving wildlife habitat. There is to be an informal walk and talk in the wood with Nigel Williams (FC) and his colleagues on Wednesday 15th June at 1.30 pm, meeting at the old 'hut' on the lane just past Old Hall Farm (grid ref SD 326 855) . Just come along and join in (without your car please, as parking is limited here). Contact the Clerk if you would like more details. Some of the eight notice boards in our Parish are in a poor state, particularly the smaller ones which were made by a firm from away and which are not up to the rigours of our weather. The Nibthwaite board will be the first to be replaced, with the one at Lakeside to follow when funding permits. The boards at Bouth are also suffering and we hope to provide a new larger one in due course. The Colton board had its door caught by the wind and broken because the bolts were not shut properly. Please try to secure the doors when fixing notices, and bolt them properly afterwards, as the cost of repair is significant. If anyone has joinery skills and is willing to 'look after' a board for us, making small repairs where necessary, that would be very welcome. Please contact the Clerk.

Our next Parish Council meeting is on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> June, 7.30 pm at Colton Church Hall, when we expect a planning officer to be speaking about housing policies within the new Core Strategy.
