COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

A590 roundabout at Greenodd: You may have seen in the press that the planned visit by the Transport Minister to Cumbria to view the safety issues on the A590, including the urgent need for a roundabout at Greenodd, never materialized. It was rumoured that the proposal had been dropped. However, your local MPs and County Councillors went to London and persuaded him to put the scheme back on the agenda. Some funds have now been allocated for preparatory work to continue and the scheme is to be 'put forward' during 2013/14. We will keep the pressure on. National Grid has published proposals for linking the equipment of electricity generating companies in the North West to the national grid. These include a number of offshore wind farms and a proposed 3.2GW nuclear power station in West Cumbria. The implications for our area could be above-ground power lines across the landscape. It is also useful to have details of where obvious motorbike tracks are seen anywhere away from the legal green roads, and where vans are parking up to unload motorbikes. For immediate reporting to the police of illegal activity at the time it is happening, just ring the non-emergency number 101, and the police will try to get there.

SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL

The next meeting of Satterthwaite Parish Council will be held on Monday 2nd July at 7.30pm in the Parish Room.

On Monday 11th June Peter Brown and Sam Mason (Grizedale – Go Ape) spoke about plans for a new project – a Zip Trek course for a wilderness experience – to combat falling visitor numbers and to sustain employment. An impact assessment has been done by the Forestry Commission to the satisfaction of the Planning Authority. Councillors expressed concern about (i) use of mini-bus ferry and would have preferred something more environment-friendly, and (ii) lack of onsite accommodation for employees.

There is still a vacancy for a parish councillor but for the time-being SPC will function with 4 members.

Anyone interested in becoming a parish councillor should contact Cllr David Fletcher (Chairman).

Like other councils in the area, SPC has been granted £800 to spend on verge maintenance. It has resolved to earmark £200 for improvement of Nursery Lane; to cut roadside saplings and to improve visibility at junctions; to survey the parish to determine most needy areas; and, to receive suggestions from the public (contact Cllr Gary Thomason).

With shared concerns about the Stricely Fell Caravan Site, SPC is to work with Colton PC to monitor developments.

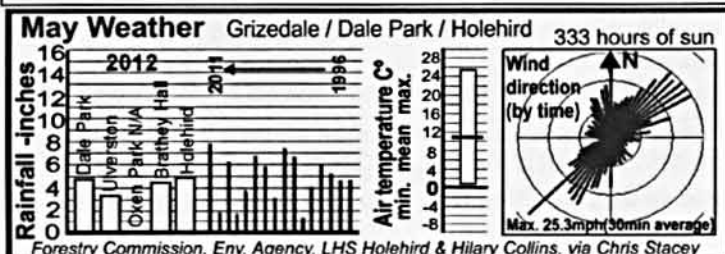
Cllr Mhari Elkington-Crabtree asked about broadband. It seems that has been a temporary break down in negotiations between Cumbria County Council and BT and Fujitsu to roll out fast broadband. The contract may be awarded in September which would put roll out back again a further two months or so.

Cllr Mike Thornley reported on the Red Kite Liaison Group meeting of 8th June, at which Iain Yoxhall presented a map of sitings – majority of them to the south. The last release will be in August with 3 local schools invited to be present. Future monitoring of the kites is likely to be done by volunteers.

NEED FREE HELP AFTER AN OPERATION OR ILLNESS?

Reablement is a service provided by Cumbria County Council through the Adult Social Care department. It aims to help people regain their independence following an illness, disability or loss of their personal support network. It is free, and provided for up to 6 weeks.

The service aims to help and support you to do things for yourself, rather than do them for you, with the goal that you will soon be 'back on your feet'. Perhaps you have had an operation, illness or accident and need some extra help with day-to-day tasks like getting dressed, preparing meals and doing household chores.

Almost everyone is entitled to Reablement, but lots of people just don't know about it. You need to be over 18 years of age, live in Cumbria and be able to live at home with some support. Contact your local Adult Social Care Office to find out more on 01539 713378 or 713331.

It may be that after an illness or operation you are struggling financially as well as physically, remember the CAB is here to help. We can give you advice about benefits specific to your circumstances and let you know about other sources of help and support in our area.

Free, confidential advice and help is available from the Citizens Advice Bureau on any aspect of debt, benefits, employment, housing and any other problems.
