COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The traffic problems with the A590, and the effects on local roads in the Parish, with cut throughs and diversions when accidents occur, are well known. The Parish Council are actively supporting efforts to bring all the interested parties, Highways England, Cumbria County Council, Dept of Transport, the Police and others, together with local residents at a public meeting in the Spring. Watch this space! Concerns over speeding and accidents, particularly on the Tottle Bank road, and the hill down to Spark Bridge, have been around for a long time, and the Parish Council is still trying to get something done! A planning application came to the January 13th PC meeting from the Swan Hotel at Newby Bridge. Their plan is to build a new extension with 28 bedrooms, and a swimming pool and spa, which will be a significant addition to their business. The extra employment and economic development this brings is welcome but councillors felt that the flooding issues and particularly traffic problems were major concerns. The access over the narrow bridge is already a bottleneck for hotel visitors and local residents alike and the hotel expansion plus the proposed extra car park for staff and visitors, could make for severe traffic problems. The matter will be decided by the Lake District National Park Authority but if you wanted to look at the details and send them your comments visit www.lakedistrict.gov.uk/planningsearch, and enter 7/2019/5835 into the reference search field. HELP FROM CITIZENS ADVICE

Q. I bought a present for a special anniversary from an online store. I paid extra for next day delivery but it hasn't arrived. The online store has said my parcel is with the delivery company. I tried to contact the delivery company but wasn't able to speak with anyone. What can I do?

A. You paid for next day delivery so your goods should be delivered on the agreed date. It's the seller's responsibility to make sure the item is delivered. They should chase the courier - it's not

your responsibility.

form.

You can cancel your order and ask for your money back because you haven't received your goods on the agreed date. Tell the seller it is "a breach of contract under the Consumer Rights Act 2015" - as the delivery date was essential and it wasn't met. You could try to get your special present from another online store or a local shop, if there is time. You can find useful template letters and information about your rights on the Citizens Advice website.

Dear Friends, Small Steps

How as individuals can we make a difference? In her recent Christmas broadcast the Queen said "as we all look forward to the start of a new decade it's worth remembering that it is often the small steps not the giant leaps that bring about the most lasting change". When Jesus was calling his first disciples he famously challenged Simon Peter and his brother Andrew to leave their fishing boats and "Come, follow me and I will make you fishers of men".
