The total rainfall for 2014 was 77.39", with September the driest month with only .67". December was a wet month - 9.73" fell. The average for the last 12 years is 75.89". The driest year was 2010 (52.85"), with July as the wettest month of that year, and the wettest year was 2012 (99.05").

SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL

At the Meeting of 6th January:

PCSO Emma Forrester reported that there had been no crimes reported to Cumbria Police during the period 26th November - 6th January. There were two reports of suspicious vehicle activity that might be linked to poaching but nothing has been verified. (The general public is urged to phone the police to report their suspicions. This can be done via the '101' service or, if an incident is taking place by phoning '999'. Anonymity can be secured if needed by using the 'Crimestoppers' line 0800 555 111 although the '101' and '999' services can preserve a caller's identity if it is requested.) Debbie Binch, Environment Agency Rapid Response Community Engagement Offer - Cumbria, spoke about the need for communities to identify locations likely to suffer flash flooding and to undertake a resilience project to cope with such an event. Councillors resolved to include something about this in the Community Plan and to look further into what can be done at its next meeting.

Councillors registered their appreciation of the contributions of Tim Gill and Sam & Emma of the Eagle's Head to the Christmas display in the centre of the village.

Councillor Mhari Crabtree reported that responses to the Community Plan questionnaire were being returned but urged for all to participate in the process.

Councillor Gary Thomason agreed to press South Lakeland District Council to do extra road sweeping to clear leaf-fall and Cumbria Highways, thereafter, to undertake extra drain cleaning.

After a vigorous debate, councillors resolved to submit a request to South Lakeland District Council for a Precept of £5,000 (a small increase on that submitted last year - £4,750.

The next meeting is on Tuesday 24th February at 7.30pm in Satterthwaite Parish Room.

Tax Return Deadlines

If you have to complete a tax return for 2013/14, and you haven't yet sent it to HMRC, remember not to do it on paper. You may end up having to pay a £100 late-filing penalty. The deadline for sending in (filing) a paper tax return for the tax year ending 5 April 2014 was 31 October 2014. If your paper return is delivered to HMRC after that date, you will be charged a £100 penalty, unless you have 'a reasonable excuse' for sending it late. This applies even if you have no tax to pay. Alternatively, if you complete your tax return online, you have until 31 January 2015 to send it to HMRC. To send an online tax return, you must be registered for HMRC Online Services. This involves HMRC sending you an activation code in the post, so you need to allow time for this to arrive. You can register for online filing on the GOV.UK website at www.gov.uk. Most people don't have to complete a tax return. You can check whether you need to complete one by using a tool on the GOV.UK website at www.gov.uk. You can find guidance on what might be accepted as a reasonable excuse for not filing a tax return on time on the HMRC website at www.hmrc.gov.uk. This page also gives information about how to appeal against a late-filing penalty.

Dear Friends.

I was told recently, by a wise person, that the effectiveness of an article such as this was often inversely proportional to its length (i.e. the shorter the better). At first sight this seems good news – surely producing fewer words should require less effort?

In practice, of course, writing (or saying) something which is both succinct and memorable often takes real skill. Lord Sacks (previous Chief Rabbi and a regular contributor to Thought for the Day on Radio 4) is a master at it and Jesus' parables are particularly fine examples. One of my tutors at ministerial training used to tell us "Where possible, say it in a sentence". Let me challenge you to do just that. Try expressing in one sentence what, for you, is most important in life. For my part I

might choose part of the song I heard at Hawkshead School yesterday – "If I don't have any love in my heart nothing really matters at all".


