HAWKSHEAD&SATTERTHWAITE COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS

This is not an appeal for money. We have enough in the kitty for the moment and we know how generously you respond when we do have to ask.

But we do need some practical help.

First, we need help with our committee. Like any other charity, there has to be a committee to guide our affairs and, very importantly, to ensure that the money so generously given to us is safeguarded and properly spent. It's not an onerous job: usually two meetings a year. But we do need fresh blood, if that's not an unfortunate way to put it. The Secretary would like to be free to help with the training; the Treasurer, though still skilled with his abacus, would like some relief and the Chairman is getting decidedly long in the tooth. None need be active First Responders themselves: not all are at the moment. It is, however, an important and worthwhile contribution to the community and to a charity which deserves to be kept going.

Second, we have 9 active First Responders at the moment, only the bare minimum to cover our large area, from Outgate to Bouth. We received 44 call-outs during 2013, 25 of which we were able to attend. So, we'd welcome new recruits. You'd be making a real and sometimes literally vital contribution to the community. SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT 2014

Progress with the Community Led Plan has been slow, but like other parish councils we are trying to jump through the same bureaucratic hoops. With shrinking numbers in our communities, engagement is difficult. We have been updating the plan and are hoping to have it ready for publication in the New Year. If adopted, then the hard work will begin, with the implementation of the plan and the formation of a community action group. Nevertheless, we are making progress with many of the issues highlighted in the draft Parish Plan.

We are now at the end of the first year of implementation of the Community Lengthsman scheme. This scheme has been very well received with no negative feedback. We have now budgeted in this scheme for the life of this parish council, having raised the precept slightly next year in order to do so and see good reasons why the precept should be raised above inflation in the future to accommodate this scheme. The Satterthwaite car park project is on hold until we have finalised the Community Led Plan which will give the parish council a better chance of gaining planning consent and access funding streams that are available to the community. The PCmeetings have been well attended by all councillors over the year and issues have been well debated. Highways issues over the year have include the difficulties caused by parking on the roadside at Grizedale and in front of the Church area in Satterthwaite. We are looking to the Forestry Commission to help resolve the problems with parking and congestion on our roads through Grizedale when outside events are taking place. Gritting this winter has not been an issue because it was very mild. Thanks to our Community Lengthsman, David Walker of Force Forge, the effects of flooding were kept to a minimum, with great improvements in drainage being made in many areas. I would like to thank David for his efforts and his diligence. Dog fouling on the village green has been resolved.

The recreation ground is now under the management of the parish council which is in the process of reviewing how it is best run. The main issues to be dealt with, will be long term viability of the play area, because of the small number of residents with children now and the overall costs incurred to retain the area to the same standard. We may have to look at an alternative use for this area but this may be something to consider in the Community Led Plan. The main concerns in the community are still those put forward in our draft plan and reflect the pressures of a decreasing and ageing local population. However, these will have to be revisited in the revised Community Led Plan as recent events have threatened the loss of our neighbouring doctors' surgeries at Hawkshead and Coniston. The council fully supports the retention of both services as the closure of these surgeries would make life so much more difficult for all here and in the wider community. There may also be issues with the access to adult social care with regards to a shrinking service and the need to use the third sector to facility theses services in the future. On a good note the Eagles Head has new ownersand we them well in their new business venture. Go Ape is expanding its business activities at Grizedale by offering Junior Go Ape, Go Ape Adventure Safari and Segway Safari . The parish council had reservations about the transportation of clients by mini busfrom Grizedale to the Adventure Safari site. The parish council agreed in principle to development but registered itsconcerns. Go Ape is now making alternative arrangements, which is a positive response and outcome. If, staffing levels are increased (up to 40?) during the summer months this should have a positive effect on the community and for the businesses in the area. Though issues remain regarding the accommodation of people working in the valley and the extra vehicular activity. We wish them well. Cllr David Fletcher (Chair)


COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

All About Highways: At its June meeting, the Council

reviewed the list of ongoing Highways-related issues. These include re-painting of various road markings (e.g. double yellow lines around Bouth Village Green), substantial repairs needed on the Bessie Bank road and the Ickenthwaite loop, and enquiries about SLOW signs at Oxen Park. Communications with Highways appear to be at an all-time low: we are still unclear about who is our liaison officer, reports to the Highways hotline go un-acknowledged, and we are no-longer consulted about re-surfacing priorities. These problems were discussed at a recent 'South Lakeland District Parishes Association' meeting, and it seems most parishes are experiencing the same breakdown in communications whatever happened to Localism?! The Area Highways Engineer for South Lakeland will be asked to attend the next meeting in the autumn. On the plus side, we have worked together with one very helpful officer at Highways to get some trees cut back at Lowick Bridge and drainage works resolved at Colton – so there is hope!

If you want to add your voice to the present Highways issues – then please phone 0845 609 6609 or Email: highways@cumbria.gov.uk. We have intervened in works planned for July (laying electricity cables) at Tottlebank

crossroads, and asked that works be delayed until the autumn. The 4 roads meeting at the crossroads were each to have been closed for a week at a time with various diversions, some of which were definitely not suitable (Cappy Lane/Hellpot Bridge for example....!). BUT, officers from Highways and Electricity North-West have been extremely helpful following a meeting at the cross-roads – they have rescheduled the works and re-routed the diversions. CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends.

As of course you know, many people who live and work here are involved in the tourist industry in one way or another, and that is also true of the churches. We get visitors from all over the world. The churches at Hawkshead, Sawrey, Rusland and Satterthwaite are all kept open during the day and all receive a significant number of visitors.

People visit churches on holiday for all sorts of different reasons. It may be something you have done yourself in other places. You go into a church building, perhaps because it is an attractive building, perhaps because it is something to do, perhaps because it is cool inside on a hot day, or dry when it is raining. You look around, and then, because your feet are tired, you have a little sit down and a quiet moment.

And then maybe what you find is that the experience is somehow more than the sum of its parts. You are doing more than just sitting quietly in an old building.

This is perhaps partly because we so rarely sit quietly and do nothing, or because, no matter what we believe, it is moving to be in a building that has been set aside for prayer and worship, a building that exists because of a belief thatthere is more to life than our day-to-day concerns. And it is a place where many people before us have found something similar, and have done so for generations. As a Christian I believe that this is one of the ways in which God speaks to us.

It is our hope and prayer that people find something significant in our churches, whatever they choose to call it.
