SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS Thank you to everyone who has filled in and returned the Parish Council's questionnaire regarding the additional parking requirements in the village. Grant Nickson has summarised the results. Overall the comments were very positive. It is recognised that the village needs extra parking and some other areas other than the land beside the church were suggested but some of the land is privately owned, and the Parish Council felt that the land would be more valuable to the owners as land rather than a car park Also some of the areas suggested were too far out of the centre of the village and the council feel that a car park on these areas wouldn't be used. We will be having more discussions in future meetings and exploring the possibility of the other organisations helping with the parking solutions.

The lengthsman is carrying out a lot of work on verges at the moment and will carry on doing so at the moment.

The Rural Crime Group will be carrying out surveys to see where best to site the two cameras that they have purchased, with a view to buying more.

Current councillors are Grant Nickson (Chair), Gary Thomason (Vice Chair), Mhari Elkington-Crabtree, Mike Thornley and Helen Bright. It was proposed that instead of meeting four weekly the council meet six weekly which was agreed by the council

CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends.

A couple of quotations which got me thinking:

'The youth is rotten to the very bottom of their hearts: the young people are malicious and lazy, and they will never be as youth used to be before. Today's youth will not be able to maintain our culture' and secondly:

'Our youth loves luxury, has lack of manners, disregards authority and has no respect whatsoever for older people; today's children are tyrants; they contradict their parents and tyrannise their teachers- they are just very bad.'

Many people would say, 'How true!' Others, who are younger, will wince at yet another sweeping and insulting statement about their generation, and will probably have stopped reading by now.

In fact, these sentiments are not anything particularly new. These quotations are not from letters to The Telegraph. The first outburst was inscribed on a pot in Babylon, dating from about 2000 BC; the second is attributed to Socrates in about 400 BC. The older generation have always been concerned about the behaviour of the younger and probably always will be.

But there is a tendency in all human beings to seek blame other people for all that is wrong with the world. We might blame the youth, or the foreigner, or women (if we happen to be men) and, no doubt, men if you are a woman.

The author of the message on the Babylonian pot was concerned that his culture was going to come to an end and that it was going to be the fault of the young people, or at least that's who he blamed. In fact, he needn't have worried too much- his particular culture lasted for another 1500 years at least.

HAVE YOU HAD PROBLEMS WITH ON-LINE PARCEL DELIVERY?

Citizens Advice research has found that two in three online shoppers have had parcels delivered late, damaged, left in nonsecure places like rubbish bins, or 'failed' -where they wait in, only to receive a note saying they were out. Most people don't complain, or find that the sender says it's not their fault.

The retailer is responsible for getting orders delivered to you, not the parcel company. Contact the sender if an item hasn't arrived by the date agreed or within 30 days. You can cancel the order and get a refund for the goods and basic (not premium) delivery costs.

If a parcel is damaged, contact the retailer and they should either offer to send you a new item or refund you.

If someone was waiting at home for the parcel, but a note said it couldn't be delivered, you can cancel the order and get a refund if it's been less than 14 days since you bought it - or just arrange another delivery time. Although legally you're not entitled to compensation, it's worth complaining to the delivery firm and retailer.

If you get a note saying your parcel has been left in a certain location but it isn't there, the retailer should replace it or give you your money back. If you receive the item but aren't happy with where it was left, complain to both the retailer and delivery firm, though there is no legal right to compensation.
