HELP FROM CITIZENS ADVICE

Q. I have just discovered that my brother has got into debt and is having to use a food bank because he has no money left after his monthly payments. He told me it is because he bought some furniture on a 'Buy now, pay later' deal which he thought was really good, but he did not realise how high the interest payments were going to be when they kicked in. How can I help him? A. Suggest to your brother that he looks on the Citizens Advice website, or contacts his local Citizens Advice, for help on dealing with debt. He is not alone in being caught out by BNPL (Buy now, pay later) deals - over 10 million people use them but they are totally unregulated. The government itself calls it a "Wild West" situation. Citizens Advice has been campaigning for the past few years for BNPL products to be brought into regulation, and new legislation has now been announced. From next year, BNPL firms will need to follow consistent standards — so shoppers will know exactly what they are signing up to, whether they can afford it, and how to get help when things go wrong.

That means upfront checks to make sure people can repay what they borrow, fairer and faster access to refunds, and the right to complain to the Financial Ombudsman — bringing BNPL in line with other credit products.

In the meantime, encourage your brother to get help, because debt can be managed once you know how to tackle it.
