SPRING INTO SUMMER!

Nearly five years ago, Bobbie Dobson and John Milburn came to a Colton Parish Council meeting and said "What are you going to do about the appalling state of our green lanes?" To cut a long story short, after a lot of hard work by a number of people (including Parish Councillors, our recently departed County Councillor, Rod Wilson, and Keith Masser of Highways), sufficient money has been found to carry out some repairs on the two green lanes that lead from Ickenthwaite, to the west and south. The Bethecar Commoners have also made a significant and welcome contribution. Work started at the beginning of May and should be completed over the summer.

Repair of these two routes will form a 'pilot study' to see just what is required to bring all the other green lanes back up to standards for normal agricultural use and will be followed by a period of monitoring which will inform the authorities about issues such as maintenance requirements, effects of recreational traffic, and even climate change. It may seem ironic that money has finally been collected to mend a 'track' at a time when potholes are appearing on the M6 but, if something isn't done now, we may lose our green lanes forever.

SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the meeting on 14th May, Peter Brown, Area Manager of Go Ape! outlined a proposal to make a planning application for a junior course to boost visitor numbers. Councillors responded positively and resolved to see the application before writing a letter of support.

Councillor Fletcher reported that he had discussed the idea of creating a locals' car park in the field behind the church with Mairi Lock of the Lake District Planning Authority. Ms Lock explained that she had some concerns about the visual impact and the impact on the trees in the field. She was not sure from the information supplied what extent of excavation would be required and whether there would be a high retaining wall if the intent was to provide a level car park. She asked Councillor Fletcher to provide a cross section showing how much excavation would be required. Also, she said a landscaping scheme would be required with any planning application along with details of surfacing, whether the access needs widening and how the use of the car park was to be controlled to ensure availability only to residents and users of the Church.


Force Forge area in before moving to a different location, possibly Dale Park. The parish council has received a letter of appreciation for the work Mr Walker has done.

COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Green Roads Repair: Work is now underway on the 2 'pilot project' green roads (U5064 Nibthwaite to Ickenthwaite road and the U5213 Oxen Park to Ickenthwaite road). Drains are being dug, culverts and bridges repaired and eroded sections filled. The contractors are working closely with land-owners and the Bethecar Commoners.

Highways: We know, we know.....road surface and potholes are dreadful! Highways is really struggling with their huge budget cuts and have not been able to get to Colton Parish since last August, apart from urgent repairs. Your Clerk has given up reporting all the potholes, and is just sending in the worst cases when she is aware of them. New County Councillor: It seems that Colton Parish was reallocated to a different County Council ward just before the May elections (although there was, surprisingly, no formal notification of this). We are now apparently in High Furness ward and, as a result, are sad to lose Cllr Rod Wilson who worked extremely hard for the parishes in his area; in particular he kept the pressure on with Highways, gaining the go-ahead for speed limits at Bouth and green roads repair, allocating a significant part of his budget to Colton. The Council recorded their thanks to Rod and welcomed our new County Councillor, David Fletcher, from Satterthwaite, who attended our May meeting wearing his two hats — County AND District Councillor!

Litter: The build-up of litter in our verges is getting worse, and that notorious spot – Tollbar to Tottlebank cross-roads, was in a bad state. It seems that our agreement with SLDC to have this cleared regularly had lapsed. However, once notified, SLDC did clear it again, and have also been around some of our roads with the sweeper, which has helped with the encroaching verges. We have asked for a copy of their litter-clearance schedule.

EXTRAORDINARY WEATHER AT START OF 2013 The comments below are from Holehird Gardens April weather

Since January we have experienced one of the most prolonged periods of cold in the memory of most people. The last time Windermere froze over was 1963 and before that, 1929. But It has also been unusually dry at Holehird, at times arid, and still no sign of real soaking rain, unlike the south of England. The only significant precipitation in March fell in the form of snow, about 2 feet over several days, which was measured as 2 inches of water in the rain gauge. The chill factor has added to the cold, with the wind blowing predominantly down the Troutbeck Valley from Kirkstone and the east. At Holehird gardens, the combination of 'coolth' and drought has retarded the onset of spring by about a month. Bulbs, rhododendrons, camellias, and magnolias only came into flower at the end of April / beginning of May. The Met Office reports that the jet stream, the high level tunnel of fast moving air which normally blows east across the Atlantic to pass north of Scotland, has been tracking well to the south of Britain over Spain. This has resulted in unusually cold, dry, dust laden air circling back over Britain from Siberia. Jones-the-Weather

ADDING UP THE COSTS OF EDUCATION

According to Government data 8.5% of children live in poverty in South Lakeland. This is likely to get worse. 2.8 million households across the UK will be worse off by an average of £137 under the new Universal Credit benefit due in October. This comes on the back of rising utility and food costs, squeezing household budgets.

One area of concern is the costs faced by parents in sending their children to school. Apart from school uniform and lunch money, there are costs for school trips, social activities, fundraising and so on, many of these activities are expensive, unexpected and carry social pressure to participate. It all adds up, placing a burden on stretched family budgets.

Your local Cumbria Rural Citizens Advice Bureau has contacted all the schools in South Lakeland to ask them to join in a national campaign called 'Adding Up'. We want School Governors to adopt 10 principles to help control the costs of attending school and help parents budget for activities.

You can help us. Tell us how much it costs your household to send children to school. You don't need to tell us your name or which school, we just want facts and figures so that we can encourage schools to join the campaign.
