The pub will be closed on Sunday 1st June from 6pm last food orders at 4.30pm and then reopen Tuesday 3rd June at 12pm.


The pub will also be closed during the day on Monday 9th June but will be open for food and drinks from 5pm.

COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Kirkby Moor Wind Farm proposals: Your Councillors attended a meeting of 'stakeholders' concerning RWE Energy's current proposals to replace the existing 12 42m high turbines, visible from parts of our Parish, with 7 much larger (115m) and more efficient turbines. South Lakeland District Council will hopefully consult Colton Parish Council when the planning application is submitted (SLDC planning applications can be accessed from their website:

www.southlakeland.gov.uk and click on 'Building and Planning'). The company would offer community payments through an annual fund available throughout the operational life of the wind farm and administered by the Cumbria Community Foundation. This might benefit projects in local communities from Kirkby-in-Furness to Spark Bridge. It is not clear whether Colton Parish would be eligible for any funding.

Low Hay Bridge Moss proposal: The John Strutt Conservation Foundation has submitted an application to the National Park to install a perimeter bund around Hay Bridge moss (near Bouth), part of a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). The bund would raise the water table on the Moss for restoration of the raised mire; such lowland raised mires are rare and nationally important ecological habitats. The encroachment of trees and drainage over many years has degraded the moss and the Foundation wish to restore it to its former condition. However, there are strong concerns that the bunding might cause increased flooding of the surrounding land which would impact on local livelihoods - we are all aware of how this area is already subject to extensive flooding events. The Parish Council submitted an objection to the proposals based on these concerns and also the landscape impacts of tree-felling. The application was discussed at a recent LDNPA Development Control Committee meeting where it was deferred pending further detail on flooding risk; The next meeting will be on Monday 9th June, 7:30pm Colton Church Hall.

BAILIFFS - NEW RULES COME INTO FORCE

From April, Bailiffs have to follow new rules and processes when collecting debts. The main changes include:

- Banning bailiffs from visiting at night
- Stopping bailiffs from entering a home when only a child is present
- Preventing bailiffs from taking necessary household items, such as a cooker or washing machine
- Providing greater protection from bailiff action for vulnerable people
- Making sure at least 7 days' notice of bailiff action is given and 7 days' notice before selling any belongings
- Compulsory training and certification for bailiffs
- A simplified fee structure, including set fees for each stage of bailiff action
- A responsibility to provide information at all stages of the process, with notices containing wording that is set out by law
- Distress for rent arrears has also been abolished, meaning that landlords can no longer use bailiffs to collect residential rent arrears Citizens Advice has been campaigning for many years to improve the practices of Bailiffs; we will be monitoring the action of local Bailiff to ensure they abide by the new rules. If you're in debt, don't panic. Remember it is never too late to get help and advice from Citizens Advice.
