SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL

The Council met on 22nd April. Firstly a vote of thanks was given to the outgoing clerk, Dr Suzanne Tiplady for her much appreciated work over the last few years. The Council welcomed the new clerk, David Shaw.

The chairman reported on a positive meeting with LDNPplanner Ben Long who was encouraging over the possibility of creating car parking behind the church. The Council agreed to move another step forward by having a surveyor/contractor look at the site to advise on drainage and work estimates before we go any further.

The Chairman also reported on the refreshed Village sign on the southbound approach, achieved after only a few years!

A planning application was received for changes to Deerleap in the centre of the village and the Council voted not to support the changes on the grounds that the size and scale was too much for the site. The Council agreed to look into placing 'Beware Horses' signs in the village after requests from residents.

The Chairman reminded those present of the new bus service through the village from Haverthwaite to Hawkshead and asked all residents to try to use it where possible. In particular those with holiday cottages should ensure a timetable is available in their cottages for guests to use.

No date was set for the next meeting due to the election on 1st May.



Grants are available to young people entering university education or a vocational course, or a profession or trade and who are resident in the Ancient Parish of Hawkshead, which includes the present day Parish of Satterthwaite. Applications should be made by the end of September for consideration by the governors at their October meeting.

Existing recipients of grants who are continuing their course next year should reapply. They will need to provide evidence of satisfactory study over the last year - usually a letter from their tutor or principal.

In 2007/8 grants of up to £200 were made to each of six young people and the governors plan to provide grants of a similar size this year.

Church News

Dear Friends

On the last Sunday in April we had a visiting preacher in the benefice. His name was Alex Armstrong, whom I had known when I worked over in West Cumbria. He is vicar of the parish of St Mary, Westfield in South Workington, and he spoke about life in that parish. What he had to tell us was sobering and shocking. Here are just a few statistics from his sermon:

- If you live in the parish of Westfield, on average you will die 20 years younger than in other parts of the County.
- The 'official' population of the parish is about 9,500, but the real population is estimated at about 11,000 (meaning about 1,500 people are not officially housed)
- Mortality in childbirth is 10 times the national average, and 12 times the county average.
- About ¼ of working age adults are on Severe Long Term Disability Allowance.
- 86% of school children are on free school meals.
- In the Infant School there are 2 registered alcoholics (i.e. below the age of 8) and in the Junior School (8-11), there are 3.
- Adult illiteracy and innumeracy is about 20%
- Those without any qualifications account for 43% of those without paid work, and about 20% in paid work.

This list could go on and on, but I will stop there. It is certainly food for thought. This is not some Developing World Country; it is about a 1 ¼ hour drive from where I live.
