RUSLAND & DISTRICT W.I.

Plans were made for a meal out on March 14th at The Farmers Arms. The Group Meeting will be at Rusland Reading Room on Thursday, 11th April when we are looking forward to being entertained by the Lakeland Fiddlers.

The next meeting is on Tuesday, 19th March at 7.30 p.m. at Satterthwaite when the speaker will be Sally Beamish on the Brantwood Gardens.

SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

In January, councillors resolved to request from South Lakeland District Council a Precept of £3,900.00. The council, faced with a cap on future Precepts, looked at the needs of the parish over the next five years to cover the extra commitments that it is making (to employ a lengthsman; to create a residents car park; to produce a community plan [ref. Localism Bill]; and, to maintain the playground as a free facility). Councillors, knowing that the provision of a car parking for villagers was included in the data collected for the parish plan and being conscious of how the changing nature of the community made it more difficult to rely on fund-raising to meet the costs of such a project, determined to spread that burden through the Precept. The council is now in possession of the archive of documents from the previous committee of the Satterthwaite Recreation and Play Area. Councillors resolved to maintain, for the present, the established bank account and insurance cover. Councillors Thomason and Elkington-Crabtree completed mandate change forms to be the principal monitors of the recreation area. Police reports indicate that crime levels remain low in and around the parish, though isolated incidents of theft, poaching and damage to property have been recorded. Generally, the area is a safe place to live and work.

Only one planning application has been received: for the relocation of Go Ape base and alterations in Grizedale. In January the council resolved to support the application. Councillors considered the relocation was within the visitor centre complex, unobtrusive and posed no threat to the landscape; was architecturally compatible with the existing buildings on the site; and, had taken every precaution to minimize disturbance to wildlife.

In February, Julia Wilson, Project Team Manager, ACTion with Communities in Cumbria, gave a presentation on Community Led Plans, distributed back-up documents and supplied a folio of information sheets; responded to questions; made reference to a new guidance booklet on Neighbourhood Planning; and, directed councillors to the ACT website for examples of completed plans.

At the same meeting, Colin Barr, Chairman of Colton Parish Council, explained he was elected to the Lake District National Park Authority (LDNPA) in June 2012 and has since been appointed to the Development Control Committee (formerly the Planning Board). He did not discuss planning in any depth but suggested that the following were useful sources of information: 'CALC Guide to Planning' (2008); Joint NALC/CPRE booklets: 'Planning Explained' and 'How to respond to planning applications' (available at the CPRE website

(www.planninghelp.org.uk/resources).

David Walker agreed to be the Lengthsman Next Meeting: Tuesday 12th March 7.30pm Satterthwaite.

COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Free 'Heart-Start' training: Cumbria Fire and Rescue Service are offering free Heart-Start (Emergency Life Skills) two 1-hour training sessions to all communities. They say that more than 270,000 people suffer a heart attack every year. Your help could be vital – but do you know what to do? Spending 2 hours of your life will give you the skills to try to save another person's life. It could be a family member or someone you know. Bouth '20 is Plenty' signs: The residents of Bouth are being asked their opinion of the effectiveness of the new '20's Plenty' speed limit signs erected in early 2012. Local Councillor Ken Dean has distributed a short questionnaire to all households in Bouth; once completed, these can simply be folded and put straight into the post box for sending to the County Highways 'Freepost' address. Please do complete these as it is important that we have your valuable feedback. Green Roads Pilot Project update: The two 'green roads' that meet at High Ickenthwaite (one from Nibthwaite and the other from Oxen Park) are the subject of a pilot repair project for County Highways and the National Park. These two roads have seen a lot of damage in the last 15 years or so, particularly with the increase in off-road recreational tourist traffic; you may have noticed the scouring down to bedrock at High Ickenthwaite, the large puddles and damage done to fields at Stock Farm, Nibthwaite and that Pegg Lane near Oxen Park is impassable without wellington boots. County Highways Dept. has managed to find funding, with other contributions provided, e.g. from the Bethecar Moor Commoners' Association. We hope that work will begin in the next month or so, with Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders (TROs) put in place.


CUT YOUR FUEL BILLS

CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends,

This is the season of Lent, the season when we give things up. It is also the season when people who preach in Christian churches feel compelled to try and say something about 'sin'. This is tricky, because the church talking about sin has a bit of a bad press, and generally it is something I try to avoid if I can, pulpit bashing not really being my thing. And it is a word which feels curiously old fashioned.

One of the problems is that talk of 'sin' can tend to lead us down one of two rather thorny paths: self-loathing or self-righteousness. Either I make the discovery that I am a bad person in need of punishment, or by dividing people up into sinners and righteous, I make the happy discovery that I don't quite belong with the sinners but with the righteous, if only because I am too humble to say it openly.

Jesus once came across a woman who was going to be stoned for adultery. He famously said, 'That one of you who is faultless shall throw the first stone', and one by one her accusers disappeared, until there was no one left to condemn her. Unfortunately, despite this, throughout the ages, there have been people queuing up to do their Christian duty by throwing the first stone. Sin is part of us all, both as individuals and as societies. We are complicated creatures and dividing the world into 'goodies' and 'baddies' does not work nearly as well as we pretend it does.

The Lenten exploration of sin is not meant to make us feel self-righteous, even less is it meant to destroy us and punish us.

Instead it is meant to refine us, to help us to become what we were meant to be, to relieve us of the burden of thinking we have to be right all the time.

CHURCH ELECTORAL ROLLS

This spring every Parish Church is required to prepare a new Electoral Roll, which happens every sixth year. In other years the roll is merely revised.

Everybody who wishes to be entered on the new Roll for either Rusland or Satterthwaite – including those who are on the existing Roll – should apply for enrolment by completing an application form which can be obtained from any member of the P.C.C. of each church.

Completed forms should be returned as soon as possible, and at the latest by 20th March, by handing the form to any member of the appropriate P.C.C. or by post to the appropriate Electoral Roll Officer; for Rusland Church, Mrs Gillie Dobson. Ash Slack, Ickenthwaite, Rusland, LA12 8LD; for Satterthwaite Church, Miss Jennifer Threlkeld, Satterthwaite Farm, Satterthwaite, LA12 8LS.

TAKE ACTION AGAINST 'TEXT PESTS' AND COLD CALLERS

Claims management companies should be banned from cold calling as new figures show three in five people surveyed were pestered by phone calls, emails and spam texts from these firms at some point each week. Why not put the phone down, mark the email as spam and ignore the text messages? The companies bothering you have no way of knowing whether you are entitled to make a claim and how much you might be able to get. You can make a claim for mis-sold PPI for free by contacting your bank directly. That way you get to keep all of your compensation instead of paying 25% in charges and up-front fees to a claims management company. You can find a template letter at www.adviceguide.org.uk which you can use to make a claim or go to your local Citizens Advice Bureau for help. To take action against the text pests you can forward them to your mobile phone provider and they will stop that number from texting you again. You can also complain to the Information Commissioner - they have the power to fine these companies from sending you messages without your permission. Register your phone number at the Telephone Preference Service (www.tpsonline.org.uk) and stop unsolicited mail via the Mail Preference Service (www.mpsonline.org.uk).


