RUSLAND POOL REJUVENATION

South Cumbria Rivers' Trust have just completed a fiftyfive metre de-culvert at a small stream in Rusland Pool, Cumbria.

A culvert is buried structure that allows water to flow under a road, railway, trail, or similar obstruction from one side to the other side without impediment. The site in question forms part of a wetland area and by de-culverting the site, the natural stream habitat may now be restored; quickly benefiting fish, invertebrates and other wildlife. It will allow for the creation of a riparian buffer strip and riparian woodland too. By reconnecting the underground water course with the natural floodplain, it will increase flood water storage through the restoration of natural river processes. The culvert has been there for many years and the work was funded by the Environment Agency to make improvements in the Rusland area. In addition, we will be planting around 100 native wetland flowers, such as; devils bit scabious, marsh marigold and birds foot trefoil to the area of the deculvert, further improving the habitat for wildlife. Our project officer Matthew Carroll, who co-ordinated the project, as said, 'What's great about this project, is that you get to see a brand-new river channel and

A Visit from Bishop James and Revd Sarah Moore, 29th-30th March

We are excited that Bishop James, the Bishop of Carlisle, and Sarah Moore, who is President of the United Reformed Church in Cumbria, will be visiting us on 29th March. This is as part of a Lent walk undertaken by the senior church leaders in the county, during which they will visit every Mission Community in Cumbria. We are giving them a lot to do in a short time, and most of the activities will be open for anyone to join in and we encourage you to do just that. Here is what is available:

Friday 29th March

10.30am Walk from the Ferry to Wray Castle Bishop James and Sarah Moore will be coming from Bowness and arriving via the ferry at Far Sawrey.
