COLTON PARISH COUNCIL:

We are pleased to report that our application to renew Stony Hazel Wood as an Asset of Community Value has been confirmed. We continue to support registration of eligible assets and you can find a full list of criteria and currently registered assets in South Lakeland on the SLDC website.

Highway safety remains a much-discussed issue at our meetings and the council is working with Paul Harris, our local PCSO to identify sites for the sighting of Speed Indication Devices (SIDs) to monitor traffic. If you believe there is a spot where SID monitoring would be useful, please get in touch with the clerk at clerk@coltonparishcouncil.org.uk

Water quality is also a key concern, and we are supporting the bid for bathing status qualification for Coniston Water. This would provide additional legal safeguards. As many of you will know the Love Windermere project was launched in July 2022. This is the biggest ever cooperation of sectors to tackle challenges in that lake. The partnership is developing a science-based plan to set out a road map for environmental protection that could be replicated across the UK. The parish council will continue to support all initiatives to improve water quality including reviewing planning applications in terms of suitable water treatment solutions.

The Colton Parish Link, which we know is a valuable communication method for the parish, is to be updated to allow for easier creation and circulation of local information. We do not expect any disruption whilst undertaking this changeover so please continue to supply information as before on local events or news.

The next parish council meeting will take place on Monday 20th March 2023 at 7pm at Oxen Park Reading Rooms.

CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends,

Lent is here. For Christians it's traditionally a period of testing and reflection as we remember Jesus' forty days and forty nights alone in the wilderness. Not quite alone, we're told that there were wild animals and angels who attended him. Lent is then followed of course by Holy Week and Easter. With all that's going on in the world at the moment we might well feel that Lent will have a special resonance this year. People have been experiencing significant testing in a whole variety of ways, both at home and abroad, for some considerable time already and with no quick end in sight. Christians, however, hold on to the message of Easter – that Jesus rose from the dead over 2000 years ago – which we will celebrate afresh on 9 April this year. Jesus' resurrection is the bedrock of our faith and hope in God and this includes hope in the midst of testing, not just when it's over, and this is something we seek to share with others and get alongside them in their time of need. There are both Biblical and contemporary examples of people who find themselves in particularly difficult and challenging situations, and feel desperate, but are then touched by God in some way and things turn round. For example, the disciple Peter who denied Jesus publicly but then he met his resurrected Lord and became a confident and strong leader. Or Joseph of Joseph and Mary. Prior to their marriage, Mary became pregnant and not by Joseph. Assuming she'd been unfaithful his position suddenly felt untenable and the least-worst option seemed to be a quiet separation for both their sakes. Then an angel explains to him that the Holy Spirit had brought about Mary's pregnancy and instructs him to hold firm to his commitment to her. This he obediently does and the rest we know.

Life is not easy at the moment. Let's all be supporting one another and provide a listening ear and practical help if possible. May this Lent be a time of reflection and of hope for you.

HELP FROM CITIZENS ADVICE

Q.- I've been offered a new job. The new company wants me to start as soon as possible but we're really short-staffed where I am now and I don't know how soon I'll be allowed to leave. How should I bring all this up with my boss?

A.-There are set rules about notice periods. First check your contract, if you have one. If you've been in your current job for less than one month, you won't have to give any notice, unless your contract says otherwise. If you don't have a contract, and your employer has no written record of you agreeing to a notice period, but you have been employed for more than a month, you have to give at least one week's notice. Fixed-term contracts are a bit different, as you won't need to give notice if you intend to leave on the last day of your contract. Leaving before the end of a fixed-term contract usually means giving at least one week's notice, but again check your contract to see if this is different.

Although it may be tempting to hand in your resignation as soon as possible, it's worth waiting until your new employer has confirmed your new employment, for example by signing your contract or by giving you a start date. It's then best to give your resignation in writing (email is fine), so that you have a record of the date you told your employer. You can find guidance on how to do this on the Citizens Advice website, where we have a page on handing in your notice.

Don't forget about your holiday days during your notice period. If you have any unused annual leave, speak to your employer about either taking these during the notice period or being paid back for them in your final salary payment.

Finally, sometimes people can change their mind about moving jobs or find their circumstances alter. If this happens to you, you should speak to your current employer to see what your options are and if you can stay in your current role.
