Both gigs start at around 8.45 – 9.00pm.



SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS Councillors began the meeting on 16th April by paying their respects to David Granville, who died on 12th April, following a 14 month battle against leukaemia. David and his wife Lynn moved to Satterthwaite six years ago and in that short time, David became a much valued member of the community, acting as Parish Clerk for four years, and Treasurer of both the Parish Room Committee and the Playground Committee, where he also helped greatly with the running of the annual barbecue. His business acumen secured invaluable grant-aid funding for improvements at the Parish Rooms. The Clerk is to investigate a suitable site for a commemorative bench. PCSO Laura Jackson said there had been no crimes in the parish during the previous month but two incidents were logged (lamping and poaching) but no one apprehended. She stressed the importance of members of the public, when telephoning the police, to get a log number. Farther afield, there have been opportunist thefts in the Windermere area and problems in the Hawkshead area concerning a homeless man. Over the next few weeks the police priority in the Lakes area is to combat drugs misuse. The community messaging service is now available on

The council is considering the feasibility of car parking
for locals on the parcel of land behind the church. Two
letters of concern about this were delivered to the
council. Councillor Fletcher having spoken to Mairi
Locke, LDNPA Planning Officer, is hopeful that she will
visit the field to the rear of the church to assess its
suitability for parking. He believes that if that field was
developed through the parochial church council for the
use of visitors to the church, then a formal planning
application would not be needed. Also, he reported a
recent visit by BT engineers to the site that confirmed
the need to replace the telegraph poles to raise the cable
to a more appropriate height. (Apparently, it would be too
expensive to put the cable underground.)

Councillor Elkington-Crabtree is to organize a steering group of volunteers to manage and maintain the recreation and play area.

Councillors are taking an interest in the Pub Protection Scheme.

Councillors will encourage someone from the community to act as the correspondent to the Westmorland Gazette. Councillors are determined to complete the Satterthwaite Community Plan and are planning a social event in June to consult residents. Through the local newsletters, they are to seek community representatives to form a committee, and will approach local organizations to send representatives to be on it. Councillors resolved to make the Community Plan the focus of the Annual Meeting of SPC on Tuesday 14th May.

The next Meeting is on Tuesday 14th May 2013 at 7.00pm in Satterthwaite Parish Room: this will be the Annual Parish Meeting; followed immediately by the Annual Meeting; followed immediately by an Ordinary Meeting. Members of the public are welcome ....

#### **COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

Library Service: You will know that the County Library Service has been under review, following budget cuts. Cumbria Libraries staff met with Councillors at Finsthwaite Village Hall during Finsthwaite's monthly 'book-swap' session to discuss how village halls could be used as hubs. A proposed option to use the Hall as a drop-off location for books was not viable because the books couldn't be secured. Other options are currently being considered, including internet ordering and/or delivery of selected books for specific projects.

Policing: At the recent Neighbourhood Forum meeting, the area community policing priority changed from illegal off-road issues to road traffic matters such as drink-driving, speeding, seat-belts and mobile phone use whilst driving. PC Baldwin assured the Council that illegal off-roading and poaching would still receive police attention. He reported that crime in Colton Parish remained generally low, although there had been two reports of heating oil theft in the last few weeks. An attempted robbery at Greenodd service station was an isolated incident and the two offenders have been caught and remanded.

Green Roads: Repairs to the two 'pilot project' green roads in Colton Parish (the U5064 Nibthwaite to Ickenthwaite road and the U5213 Oxen Park to Ickenthwaite road) will begin very soon, following consultations with local farmers, landowners and commoners. The U5064 is the priority for surface repair, being in severe need (some areas are eroded down to pure bedrock), with drainage works to be carried out on both routes, subject to funding limits. Kankku, an off-roading tourist business, had been in correspondence with Tim Farron MP and Highways asking for information on road closures, expressing its priorities and indicating that it might be prepared to contribute. The Council is appreciative of the County Area Highways Engineer, Keith Masser, for pressing on with this project and securing funding. Our next meetings are the Parish Open Meeting following by the Annual Parish Council meeting on Tuesday 7th May in Bouth Village Hall at 7.30pm. Everyone welcome.

#### A French Stroll

I am very lucky that this year I am able to take a Sabbatical and very grateful to those for whom it means extra work. I will be out of action for June, July and August, and I thought that I would take this opportunity to tell you about what I intend to do for the first half of the time away, and invite you to sponsor me, if you so wish.

Starting at the beginning of June I intend to walk from Hendaye (near the French/ Spanish border on the Atlantic coast) to Banyuls-sur-Mer (near the French/ Spanish border on the Mediterranean coast). I will follow a long-distance route known as the GR10 or Sentier des Pyrénées. It makes a way through the Pyrenean Mountains, mainly on the French side. It is approximately 900km (550 miles) long, and if all goes to plan should take me about 50 days. Throughout the route a number of variations are possible and unpredictable weather means that a certain flexibility is required. I intend to carry a tent and sometimes I will camp in campsites (the route deliberately seeks out mountain villages), sometimes in bunkhouses or mountain refuges and sometimes I will camp wild. I will be able to buy food most days, but a few times I will have to carry food for several days. As well as being a long way, there are

I will be able to buy food most days, but a few times I will have to carry food for several days. As well as being a long way, there are also a lot of ups and downs- something like 49,000m (160,000 ft) of ascent and descent, which is equivalent of more than 5 ascents of Everest from sea level, although not quite as dangerous I hope. I intend to keep a diary, which, with my mobile phone (with solar charger), I can publish on the internet. Any sponsorship that I make will go towards the work and upkeep of the churches I serve. - 2. Get Advice phone the Citizens Advice Consumer Service on 08454 040506, you can also report a problem and we will pass on details to Trading Standards.
- Tell Others warn family, friends and neighbours and soon word will spread. Remember....
  - If it sounds too good to be true it probably is.
  - It you haven't bought a ticket you can't win it.
  - You shouldn't have to pay anything to get a prize.
  - Never send money to someone you don't know.
  - Never give out bank details unless you are certain straight the person is trustworthy.
- Persuasive sales patter? Just say: "No Thank You".
- Contacted out of the blue be suspicious.
- If in doubt, don't reply. Bin it, delete it or hang up.
- Walk away from job ads that ask for money in advance
- Take your time resist pressure to make a decision away.
