AN ABUNDANCE OF ACTIVITY!

HERITAGE MONEY ON ITS WAY!

We are delighted to announce that the initiative Rusland Horizons: Working a Lakeland Landscape has been successful in its first-stage bid to the Heritage Lottery Fund's (HLF) Landscape Partnership Scheme. The project aims to provide rural training, employment and create exciting opportunities for residents and visitors in woodland management, wildlife, archaeology, local history and low-impact recreation, among other things.

The project will cover the area between Coniston Water and Windermere (lake), from Grizedale southwards. The award is worth £68,500 in the development year and, if completed successfully, will lead to a further £1.35M for the four-year delivery phase. Money has also been given by the Sir John Fisher Foundation.

The bid has been put together over three years by the Rusland Valley & Fells Heritage Partnership. This is an informal, voluntary group which was set up following public meetings in 2010. It comprises a mix of people who live and work in the community, as well as representatives of Government agencies and other countryside organisations. For financial and administrative reasons, the group is delighted that the LDNPA has agreed to be the lead partner.

The success of the application is due in no small part to the extensive support we received from local groups and organisations; many thanks to all of you who submitted letters of support.

Once the initial excitement has died down, the Steering Group will reconvene and a Development Officer will be recruited. We think there will be lots of opportunities for members of the local community to become involved and these will be advertised widely. We hope there will be something for everyone and look forward to sharing information in future newsletters.


SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The next Meeting of Satterthwaite Parish Council will be on Tuesday 26th November at 7.30pm in the Parish Room. Public and press are always welcome. The council last met on 22nd October. Unable to attend PCSO Emma Forrester submitted a written report for period 10th September to 22nd October. Over the past three weeks there have been six reported charity box thefts. All the reports provided the same description and police are looking for a specific person. (A photograph and details of the suspect have been published.) The Council is working very carefully to create a parking facility that will cause the least offence and the greatest benefit to the community and will hold a site meeting before consulting residents and the Park Authority. The lengthsman will be used over the next few weeks to tidy verges and clear culverts. The arrangements for winter gritting are much the same as they have been previously.

Councillors are aware that repairs are needed in the recreation area and are seeking estimates for the cost of work and grants to cover it.

An initial meeting of the group to re-draft the Community Plan met on the 14th October. It is essential that this is community led and anyone wishing to be involved should contact Mhari Elkington-Crabtree.

COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Wind-turbine application, Lowick Common: Your Council, along with other neighbouring councils, has been consulted by SLDC on an application for a large wind turbine on Lowick Common that would be visible from the western side of our Parish. This is interesting because the proposed site is just outside the National Park boundary, and policies differ either side of the boundary. The application can be viewed on the SLDC website – reference code: SL/2013/0906.

Nuclear Waste Disposal Facility: In January, Cumbria County Council's cabinet decided that West Cumbria should no longer be considered as a potential location for a deep geological nuclear waste repository and that the two districts of Copeland and Allerdale should be excluded from further consideration. The Department for Energy and Climate Change has now launched a new public consultation on the site selection process. The consultation document, which invites comments by 5th December, can be found at: https://www.gov.uk/government/consultations/geologi cal-disposal-facility-siting-process-review. A number of significant changes to the site selection process are proposed, in particular: "Clarification would be made about the level of public authority which represented potential host communities throughout the siting process (the 'representative authority'). This would be the District Council or nearest equivalent." Your Council will be considering its response.

BUYING A USED CAR? CHECK IT DON'T REGRET IT National Consumer Week starts 4 November 2013 and the CAB are launching a month-long campaign to raise awareness about buying a used car. More than 80,000 people contact the CAB each year with used car problems making it the biggest consumer issue.

When you buy a used car, your rights will depend on whether you bought the car from a dealer, from a private seller, at an auction or over the internet.

Before purchase, it is worth carrying out a check to discover whether the car has been the subject of an insurance write off, stolen, or whether there is outstanding finance from a previous sale. Mileage checks may be available. You may wish to get the vehicle inspected for mechanical faults by an expert, but there are charges for these services.

RUSLAND READING ROOM RE-ROOFED

For the last few years keeping Rusland Reading Room dry has been a battle as the old roof has deteriorated. The main problem was that the nails holding the slates had rusted and failed and slates had slipped out of position allowing rain to enter.

About 15 months ago a bequest by the Wynne Family Trust was added to the funds saved over the years from the Reading Room's income. The Committee then reviewed the situation and set itself the aim of raising sufficient funds to re-roof the building. Estimates for the work were obtained and approaches were made to grant making bodies. Nearly all the grant making bodies which were approached reacted positively and the Committee are very grateful to the following for their contributions: - The Proven Family Trust, The Rawdon Smith Trust ("The Bed of The Lake" Fund), Neighbourhood Forum, Lake District National Park Authority Community Fund, The Hadfield Trust, The Frieda Scott Charitable Trust, Cumbria Community Foundation, and The Garfield Weston Foundation

Once funding was secured a contract was entered into with Martin Hool Construction Ltd (MHCL) of Collin Pit Farm, Oxen Park. The contract price was in the region of £28,000. The work was carried out in August, September and October using Burlington Blue/Grey Strong slates laid to diminishing courses which was the style of the original 1890 roof. The lead and guttering were renewed, rotten areas of wood replaced, the chimney improved and more insulation added. Throughout the work Mike Benham, a member of the Committee, liaised closely with MHCL.

Anyone passing the Reading Room now will see that the new roof greatly enhances what is an exceptional building and the Committee believe that the hard work that has gone in to the project stands to benefit future generations. 
