COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Lengthsman: Your 'celebrity' lengthsman (*more anon!) Archie Workman, is doing a fabulous job working his way along the parish drains. Colton is a large parish of some 20 square miles, extending from the head of the Rusland Valley in the north to the A590 in the south, and from Lakeside in the east to Coniston-side in the west. It has some 50 miles of roadway to maintain, mainly UCRs (Unclassified Country Roads). We can afford to have Archie for only 2-3 days a month, so covering the whole parish is a challenge, but one he is embarking on with enthusiasm! Just some of his recent efforts include: clearing culverts of huge stones in Finsthwaite, searching for 'lost' drains from Bouth through to Oxen Park with his metal detector, clearing and cleaning them all, clearing vegetation around bridges and junctions in Rusland, and removing washout debris from the road at Nibthwaite and Rigg Wood, on Coniston-side. He is also working his way up the C5022 (Penny Bridge to Force Forge) finding and clearing drains.

County Highways: High Furness area parishes are making a representation to County Highways about the general lack of communication and consultation and particularly about the poor state of the verges which are no longer being cut back, resulting in 'lost' drains, sometimes a good 3 ft from the tarmac and therefore no longer functional. Your Clerk does, however, have very good communication with one extremely helpful Highways officer who is doing his very best to work closely with us to solve major problems.

Stolen and damaged signs: Once again, possibly the


Highways say they don't have the resources to replace

SATTERTHWAITE PARISH COUNCIL

Cumbria County Council's Cabinet has agreed and launched the Councils Public Budget Consultation 'Securing our Future'. This document highlights the challenge ahead and also indicates that over next three year the council is likely to lose a further 1,800 jobs as we intensify our efforts to save £83 million in an effort to balance our books by 2018.

The county council is very keen to hear as many views as possible on the difficult road ahead so that councillors can make informed choices when they agree the Budget in February 2015 and we would appreciate your help in getting as many people as possible to respond to our consultation. Therefore we would be grateful if you could forward the link to our budget consultation on to as many of your contacts, partners and other organisations as possible. All of the savings proposals, issues of discussion and further background on the scale of the challenge are available www.cumbria.gov.uk/budgetconsultation and the consultation document is also being circulated through libraries and council offices. The consultation, which is now open, will run until 20 January.

Dear Friends,

I'm going to let the Bishop of Carlisle, James Newcome, do the letter this month. It relates to the recent decision to bring Carlisle Diocese's 270 parishes into about 40 larger groupings (Mission Communities) with Methodist and United Reformed Church congregations. There is still quite a bit of work to be done before we know how this decision will be worked out in the parishes covered by this newsletter.

The Bishop writes: This step has been the subject of much discussion over the last year. Now that we have had the vote we want local conversations to continue and for Mission Communities to emerge. There is an element of urgency here, and of reality too. We do face financial pressures and there is also a shortage of stipendiary clergy. But this is not a strategy for managing decline, it is a way of becoming a more effective and faithful, sustainable and growing church.
