#### RUSLAND HORIZONS

Here's a taster of some of our forthcoming events.

Dry stone walling with Jim Doherty: There are two dates planned, Sunday 31st October and Saturday 20th November. Both events will be held at Abbot Park Farm, above Bandrake Head. Whether you're an experienced waller or would like to try this traditional skill for the first time, this is a great hands-on event led by the very experienced Jim Doherty - full time dry stone waller. Our walls are such a treasured part of our landscape, and there is nothing more satisfying than standing back and admiring a section you have helped to restore.

Hedgerow Planting: We will be helping to plant a completely new line of hedgerow at Thwaite

Head in November. This is exciting for any number of reasons including helping with local biodiversity and providing a new, safe habitat for our native species. It will also be great fun to learn about the different native species chosen to plant, including taking into account climate change challenges and finding out how the hedge will be maintained until it is mature enough for traditional hedge laying.

Polytunnel Work Party: Our polytunnel will remain in storage for a short while longer until we are able to establish it at one of two possible earmarked sites. However, so as not to miss the current seasonal opportunity, we are delighted that Tony Woods, at Abbots Reading, has kindly offered to let us use an existing polytunnel at his farm. We will be holding a work party to help with clearing out of the polytunnel, mainly of brambles, before being able to put it to good use for some wildflower cultivation and growing of saplings. #### Dear Friends,

I'd like to take this opportunity to introduce myself to you all. My name is Matt Hirst, and I am the new minister at Hawkshead Hill Baptist Chapel. Together with my wife Ali and our 4-year-old daughter Oliva, we moved from the Rossendale Valley in Lancashire into the community of Hawkshead Hill at the beginning of August. I officially started my new role on September 4th and as a family we have received such a warm welcome for which we are truly grateful. When I'm not working you will find me up on the fells or on the golf course (weather permitting obviously!) I also enjoy listening to music, and for my sins I am a loyal supporter of Arsenal Football Club! We are thrilled to be here and look forward to getting to know you all and becoming a part of the wider community of Hawkshead.

I read recently of an experiment that took place in America on a Winter's morning in 2007, to assess the behaviour of commuters at a Washington metro station. They wanted to analyse people's reactions to a violin playing busker, but this was no ordinary violinist. The busker in question was the famous violin virtuoso Joshua Bell. Apparently, his concert at the Boston Symphony Hall three days earlier had sold out when he played to more than 10,000 people. Using his 1713 Stradivarius, Bell stood in the lobby of the metro and played six of his most beautiful pieces of music, and the incredible thing was, apart from a couple of children and a handful of commuters, nobody stopped! Nobody paused to listen to the great man.

Out of context, Bell became completely invisible, and the organisers of the experiment concluded that 'the majority of people rushed ahead into their morning, unaware of the treasure in their midst.' During the last 18 months I have been learning to see things with a new perspective and not to miss the treasure that God sends my way. Treasure comes to us through many different guises. It might come through the beauty of creation; it might be a card from a friend. It might be an act of kindness extended to you which has helped to lift your spirits. However, big, or small each one has been a glimpse of God's treasure, there to uplift and indeed encourage. Perhaps this week we can all look out for glimpses of God's treasure.
