AUTUMN LEAVES

DON'T LET APPLES GO TO WASTE!
 Turn them into juice or make cider!
Apple Pressing Day ♦ Sunday 19th October 2008
 11am until 3pm
 Hawkshead Main Square & Lower Market Hall
Esthwaite Green Link is hosting a day of apple pressing and produce/plant swapping. If you have access to an apple crop, pick them and bring them along. There are varieties of apple native to our local orchards, which you won't see in the supermarket, due to their irregular shape and size. They will, however, produce delicious juice. If you bring apples, you must bring plastic containers with caps, (*not glass*) to receive the juice and in which to transport it home. Juice can be drunk fresh, or frozen, or pasteurised, or made into cider. As a rough guide 11kgs (24 lbs) of apples will produce 4-5 litres of juice. Our orchards have value. Help to preserve them by reaping the fruit crop. Dick Palmer from *South Lakeland Orchard Group* will be available to give advice about apple trees and on orchard management.
 Not necessarily just apples...If you have a glut of any other produce or plants, bring your surplus and swap your excess, with someone else's.
 Other than that...
 Bring you. With luck there will be a healthy exchange of knowledge and ideas.

Compiling a list of highway repairs for the Highway Steward

This is a new scheme akin to the old lengthsman duties. The Steward will repair potholes, cut back encroaching vegetation, clean signs and clear drains. If you know of any highway defects needing attention please contact one of your councillors.

REPORT ON 1ST SEPTEMBER MEETING

Cumbria Highways will seek funding for two road safety signs warning of horse riders; one to the north of Satterthwaite village and one near the old school. It has not been possible to obtain quotes for the demolition of the redundant fire equipment lean-to at Satterthwaite Parish Room so other options are under consideration, and the possibility of holding some Parish Council meetings at The Yan for Grizedale residents seems unlikely after a prohibitively expensive quote from the Forestry Commission. Initial water flow measurements at Farra Grains show that a hydro-electric turbine is feasible and contact has been made with an engineer already working on a similar scheme in Duddon. The response from second-home owners to the Community Charter has been disappointing. Support was given to a planning application for a replacement farm building at Low Cunsey Farm, as the present dilapidated corrugated iron buildings are unsightly, the replacement has a lower elevation, and it is an investment in local farming. Because of pollution problems and issues with the Satterthwaite sewerage system, an engineer from United Utilities is to be asked to attend the next meeting.

After the problems of the last Mountain Bike Event, Tony Hill and Graeme Prest will attend the next PC meeting on 20th October to answer questions and say what they are going to do about better management of events in future.

COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

We have now met our new County Council-appointed 'Highway Steward', Adam Tyson, who will be starting work on the roads in Colton Parish on 20th October. Colton is just one of the parishes in his area and he will be with us for an intensive fortnight of work, four times per year. His remit includes cleaning and repairing signs, cutting back vegetation, clearing blocked gullies and, crucially, emergency pothole repairs. Penny Lovegrove (01229 861091) is his point of contact, as she is for our Lengthsman, Chris Slater. Chris continues to work with us 1 day per week. The remit of the Lengthsman, or 'Parish Steward' as we are now to call the role, might extend to include some work away from the road on paths and notice boards. We will be monitoring how the two roles work together for the future.

A representative from 'Energia in Natura', the Stribers wind-farm company, will be speaking at our next Parish Council meeting on 20th October at Finsthwaite Village Hall, followed by a representative from the 'STOP' campaign (Stop Turbines On Peninsula) at the following meeting on 1st December at Colton.

Our new Community Police Officer is PC John Baldwin, who came to introduce himself at our recent Parish Council meeting. He is based at Ulverston Police Station and will be working closely with the local councils and agencies in the area.


