GET A BETTER ENERGY DEAL


It can be extremely complicated to change energy supplier and with confusing bills it can be hard to work out the savings for all the effort. Less than 1 in 3 of us switch, but money can be saved if we are savvy with our tariff.

Here are some tips:

- Telephone your existing energy supplier and check you are on the best rate. You could explain that you are thinking of switching just to see what they offer to keep your custom. Many 'deals' last 12 or 18 months, so if you switched a long time ago there is a good chance you could make a new saving without the agro of switching supplier.
- If you are on benefits or a low income check your energy supplier knows. Ask if you qualify for a 'Social Tariff'. These offer lower rates to certain customers to help avoid 'fuel poverty'.
- If you receive Pension Credit you should automatically receive the 'Warm Home Discount Scheme' a £120 rebate for this winter. Check your energy supplier is registered for the scheme so you don't miss out.

Are you off the gas grid and rely on heating oil? Do you struggle to pay in advance for your oil delivery? Do you know of an Oil Club operating in our area? Let us know your experiences.

The Citizens Advice bureau has worked with Ofgem, the energy regulator, to produce some film clips to help people be more confident on energy matters. They include hints, tips and advice on shopping around, being energy efficient, dealing with sales people and making complaints. COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Government's Draft National Planning Policy
Framework: You may be aware of government
proposals for major changes to the planning system,
central to which is to be a 'presumption in favour of
sustainable development'. Development would be
approved unless 'the adverse impacts of development
would significantly and demonstrably outweigh the
benefits'. Local neighbourhood plans will be central to
the process, though it is not yet clear at what level
they will operate. Your Council is compiling a
response to this consultation. Individuals may

Old Hall Community Woodland, Bouth: A meeting was held in Bouth on 24th August to discuss the Forestry Commission's proposal for local involvement in the management of this ancient semi-natural woodland. Some 25 people attended and gave a positive response to the proposal. Three Forestry Commission staff and three Bouth residents (Cllr Ken Dean, Mr Paul Holden and Mr Mark Sharphouse) have formed a liaison group. If you are interested in helping out with wildlife surveys, path maintenance, making bird-boxes, or helping with coppicing, etc., please contact a member of the group.

Illegal off-roading: A group composed of local parish councils, the National Park, the Police, Natural England and the Trail Riders Federation have been working together this summer to tackle the increasing problem of illegal off-roading by 4x4s and trail bikes in this part of South Lakeland. Press releases and new signs aim to educate vehicle users about legal and illegal routes, and police campaigns have had success in catching perpetrators and issuing fixed-penalty notices. We will be putting some information on our notice-boards showing the legal routes in Colton Parish and, also, how to report illegal activity. Our next Parish Council meeting is on Monday 17th October, 7.30 pm at Bouth Village Hall (Note change of date).

Dear Friends.

There is a European morality tale about a very naughty man, who is married, but feels that his life needs a little more excitement and he decides to have an extra-marital affair. He goes along to a masked ball with this purpose in mind, and there he starts to chat and dance and flirt with an exciting and exotic looking lady. Things seem to be going really well for the man. Eventually it is the end of the party. The band stops playing. The lights go on and everybody at the ball removes their masks. The man discovers that he has spent the evening flirting with his own wife. And both of them are suitably surprised and ashamed.

It is a simple little story, but I think it has surprising depth. You will deliberately misunderstand me if I say that I think many people are a bit like that man, perhaps all of us a little bit.

I don't of course mean that we are looking to have affairs, but we are looking for something else. We are looking for excitement and fulfilment. We are looking for meaning. There has never been so much interest in different types of spiritualities and ways of finding inner peace.

In the story the man thinks he has find someone exciting and exotic and mysterious. And we say perhaps he has. It is just that this exciting, exotic mysterious person happens to be his wife.

And with the kind of search that millions of people are doing in our modern times, perhaps some of them find something strange and exciting and mysterious and wonderful, but what a shock when the mask is removed! This truth, this meaning, this fulfilment can come in the shape of a church. Perhaps even the boring old Church of England.
