DALE PARK RAINFALL

The total rainfall in Dale Park for August was 10.8" second wettest only to March by a margin, and only 8
dry days in the month. (2018 7.83" and 10 dry days)
The rainfall for September up to 23rd was 5.61" and 7
dry days. (2018 7.42" and 7 dry days also)
2019 has seen 60.32" rain and 115 dry days (2018
41.9" and 127 dry days to end of September)
So nearly 20" extra of rain this year, but only 8 more
wet days.

RUSLAND and DISTRICT WI

The September meeting was held at Allan Bank, the National Trust property at Grasmere, former home of William Wordsworth, which was opened specially for us after the house had closed to the public. We were allowed to drive up to Allen Bank (normally only allowed for blue badge holders) and were warmly welcomed by the staff. A large beautiful sponge cake, filled with cream and raspberries was ready for us, together with pots of tea and coffee. We heard a most interesting talk on William Wordsworth and Canon Hardwick Rawnsley, former Vicar of Wray, co-founder of the National Trust, and his wife Edith who had retired there in 1917, explored the house, and then had a tour of the garden, and another talk about plans for the walled garden. Several members walked part of the steep woodland walk. Red squirrels frequent the garden and some of us were lucky enough to spot one. Judi Winterson gave a vote of thanks to the staff. COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Colton Parish Council met on Monday 16th September 2019 at Finsthwaite Village Hall together with lan Wharton (SLDC Councillor) and members of the public, Items discussed included the Councils approach to off road vehicles on green lanes, the latest on the LDNPA Living Lakes plan, and accidents and diversions from the A590 (see below).

Planning applications discussed included the proposal for housing at High Wood, Spark Bridge, changes to Karenwood, Finsthwalte and a footpath diversion at Bridgend, Colton. Full details of each are on the LDNPA planning website.

An update on Broadband and mobile phone availability in the Parish was submitted by Mike Postle and a new round of small community grants from Parish Council funds was announced.

Councillor Brown reported that the Parish Council had recently met with the anti-collision police officer for the area to discuss major concerns with regard to the increasing frequency of A590 accidents/road closures and incidents of speeding within the Parish. This was a very useful meeting and has led to a number of action points. We need local help and feedback though to move this forward and make our parish safer. CHURCH NEWS

Dear Friends.

Imagine you are on a beach in summer (perhaps a challenge as autumn approaches). It is a perfectly ordinary beach. In fact, perhaps it is a little too ordinary, a bit boring in fact. So you put on a pair of goggles and go for a swim. And once in the water for the first time in your life you see a tropical reef, not far below the surface. You are struck by the rich variety of colours, the iridescent profusion of fish, the wondrous patterns of corals and sponges and anemones. It is the most beautiful thing you have ever seen. It is all you can do to stop yourself laughing out loud, which would be a mistake with your head underwater. When you climb out of the water you look back to where you have just been swimming. With the refraction of sun and sky and the turbulence of the waves, all you can see is an uninteresting shadowy rocky formation below the rolling sea. We don't have to go to a tropical reef for something like that to happen. In all sorts of situations there can be moments when it seems like something falls away, and we see deeper, below the surface of everyday attention, and we get a glimpse of an unseen beauty and wonder in places and in people that seems to expand our consciousness. Perhaps those moments don't happen as often as we wish they would, but they can and do happen. A new angle on life can reveal to us the depth of beauty in places and people that we usually take for granted.


