## SUMMER BLUES? TRY SOMETHING NEW

**ANOTHER GOOD YEAR FOR THE RUSLAND SHOW**  
Every year, throughout July and August residents of the Rusland Valley, (particularly RVHS committee members!) watch with nervous anticipation as Whitestock Meadow is transformed from peaceful rural grazing to centre stage for the annual show. 2008 was no exception, as heavy showers yet again punctuated the run up to this year's show on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> August, but--the show must go on' and it certainly did.

With the sun shining and entries up on last year by nearly a third, the 125<sup>th</sup> Annual Show was set to be a corker. As eager competitors in all the produce, art and crafts sections arrived at 12:30 to see the results of the judging, they were left guessing for a few more minutes, as the judges were still deliberating over the high quality and large number of entries, around 1150 in total.

However, it was a good opportunity to stop and take in some of the day's sporting events.

The first race of the day was the Rusland Trophy Five Mile Race which saw a good turnout with 37 runners. Congratulations to Sean Bolland who was first across the line, even with a slight detour for wet ground he was only two seconds outside the course record. He was closely followed by Paul Dugdale. The fell races were also well supported with around 50 entries across the age groups and there was some strong competition for the shorter events from as far afield as Chelmsford! Other events throughout the afternoon included the children's fancy dress, pet show and dog with the waggiest tail competition. There was plenty to see and do for all the family in the rural crafts tent and the Grizedale Forestry Commission stand. The bouncy castle and tombola also proved a big success.

Back in the Horticultural and Home Produce tents, judging complete, there was strong competition and some serial prizewinning from Margaret Postlethwaite, Nigel Buckley, Gordon and Elsie Wilkinson and an outstanding array of fruit and vegetables, floral, culinary, artistic, photographic and craft exhibits from all ages. Next door in the local interest tent, visitors and locals alike were enjoying displays from Rusland Valley Horticultural Society, Rusland and Satterthwaite churches, Rusland Valley Community Trust and Oxen Park Cinema Club who also

had the results of this year's film competition. Later in the day everyone gathered for the presentation of trophies by this year's president Mr Geoff Barker. In particular, congratulations go to David Johnson for an outstanding performance in the vegetable classes. As the race programme drew to a close, those who remained were treated to a very closely fought and entertaining tug of war competition - each round went to a tie breaker and a good time was had by all. So another successful Rusland Show was over. Many thanks to everyone involved. 
### OXEN PARK CINEMA CLUB

### COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Cllr Penny Lovegrove attended a presentation on affordable housing called 'Owning the Assets', organised by the Cumbria Rural Housing Trust. "Community Land Trusts" are 'not-for-profit' organisations, based in and run by the local community, that own land and property for the long-term benefit of local people. If suitable land can be found, this approach seems a possible way forward for Colton Parish.

At our July meeting, Mr Andy Bennet of the Forestry Commission presented a management plan for Old Hall Wood, Bouth. This will involve removal of all the spruce trees and gradual thinning of the larch to leave a good mixture of broadleaf and larch trees, with areas of coppice much like the adjoining Woodland Trust wood. Footpaths and permitted paths will be diverted during operations and re-instated thereafter. We are being consulted on changes to mental health services by the Cumbria Primary Care Trust. The proposal is to concentrate resources to provide fewer, but higher-quality facilities. **Church News**

**Dear Friends,**

*It is a mystery of the human condition that we are so concerned with what other people think about us. How people respond to us matters more than we would ever like to admit. If they are amused at our jokes, we begin to think that we are funny. If they praise us, we become more convinced of our value. But if they avoid our gaze as we enter a room, or look impatient when we are talking, or constantly criticise us, we may begin to have feelings of self-doubt and worthlessness. We find ourselves always looking for the kind of things we get from a partner or spouse: something a bit like love. Alain de Botton describes what we want: 'Our presence is noted, our name is registered, our views are listened to, our failings are treated with indulgence and our needs are ministered to.' You might think that we would be happy to receive such care and attention from just a few people, but it seems that if anybody ignores us or apparently does not like or respect us, then we are hurt. I suspect that this is as true of people living in the Rusland Valley, as it is of people working in the central London.*

*In an ideal world we would not mind so much. We would be unshaken whether we were ignored or noticed, praised or jeered at. We would know our own worth and value and not worry about what other people thought. But to a large extent we still define ourselves by what other people think.*

*I believe that Christians have one great advantage. We know what the greatest being in the Universe thinks of us. It was one of Jesus' central claims that all human beings, however slow-witted, untalented and obscure we seem to ourselves, are creatures of God and loved by him. This is an audacious challenge to the world's assumption that some people are great and some are mediocre. There are no human beings outside the circle of God's love.*

**HANNAH WILSON 1925-2008**

Friends and family said goodbye to a remarkable lady at Rusland Church on 9<sup>th</sup> August at the memorial service for Hannah Wilson. The vicar, the Reverend John Dixon, was on holiday abroad but three of his predecessors were present to honour Hannah to whom Rusland Church meant so much. The Reverend Doreen led the service and gave the address: The Reverend Derek Tinsley played the organ and Canon Stephen Pye read the lesson.

In a short personal epitaph, before reading the lesson, Canon Pye said "I have been a parish priest for 25 years. I have never met a sweeter person than Hannah and probably never will".

Hannah's life started amongst the splendours of Kashmir and ended amidst the beauty of the Rusland Valley. In between she devoted herself to benefiting her fellow human beings both in her profession as a nurse and in her indefatigable work for good causes. Whatever she did, she performed with a warmth and humanity that shone through. She was the most Christian of people.

Hannah was a remarkable person. We shall miss her greatly.
