Friends and family gathered from near and far at Satterthwaite Farm throughout the day on 27th August to congratulate Lesley (Les) Threlkeld on attaining his century. Les was born in Lancashire and farmed near Hoghton for many years before he. his wife Betty and children Jennifer and David moved to farm at Ormandy Farm (now the Grizedale Lodge Hotel) in 1959. Subsequently the opportunity arose to take the tenancy of the Home Farm at Grizedale, which son David was able to move to, whilst Les bought Satterthwaite Farm in 1966, which has been home ever since. Les has always been impeccably turned out in collar and tie. even when driving a tractor or feeding hens, as the many photos will attest. Thursday was no exception, and Les was able to hold court in style, whilst visitors came in waves to wish him well. The house was full of congratulatory cards, including "The One" from HM the Queen and (perhaps even more special!) one from Blackburn Rovers, of whom Les has been a lifelong supporter. And parked outside, decked with balloons, was the first tractor that Les owned, which is still in work at Home Farm.

It was a very special day, and daughter Jennifer deserves much credit for looking after Satterthwaite's National Treasure so well!

WEATHER FAILS TO DAMPEN RUSLAND SHOW SPIRIT On Saturday 15th August 2009, residents from the Rusland Valley, along with visitors from further a field, braved the elements and headed to Whitestock Meadow for the 126<sup>th</sup> Annual Show.

Yet again the level and standard of entries across the classes was excellent with just under 1000 entries in total, only slightly down on 2008, in spite of the inclement weather. There was a wide selection of lovingly tended fruit and vegetables, home produce, arts and crafts. As in previous years, the 'monster made from fruit and vegetables' class proved popular in the children's section, with some very imaginative exhibits. The Rusland Valley information tent housed an interesting collection of photographic and film entries. Other displays featured photos from the recent 'Vivaldi's Four Seasons for Children' concert at Rusland church and the Italian themed evening in Satterthwaite Parish Room causing people to enquire - "which country next?" Meanwhile, at the other side of the field in the local crafts tent, people enjoyed buying and tasting local honey, with business proving better than expected, and a colourful array of funky buckets and watering cans helped brighten up the day.

On the sports field the fell races were as competitive as ever and were followed by various track events and the Cumberland & Westmorland Wrestling demonstration, which kept spectators well entertained. Likewise, the children's pet show was also well-supported and fun to watch and the ladies egg and spoon race was split into two races due to popular demand!

Later in the day, the sun even made an appearance for the presentation of the winners' cups. The new 'Pick a Square' draw featuring prizes donated by pubs in the local area was a big hit, with the last few squares being sold as the end-of-show auction took place, expertly conducted as always by Messrs Wingate-Saul and

#### COLTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Following earlier discussion on 'green lanes', at its August meeting the Council has agreed a number of actions to address the issues of erosion and poor driver behaviour. One very promising solution may result from discussion between the National Park Authority and the Highways Department with the Intention of introducing a programme of repairs similar to the Fix The Fells project. The Council is to ask the National Park to place a temporary Traffic Regulation Order on the High Nibthwaite - to - Parkamoor track until such time as repairs can be made and fell-sides given a chance to recover from excursions made by offroaders. A Green Lanes Working Group was formed to take forward a number of other ideas, in conjunction with local farmers.

The Community Plan Working Group would be very pleased to hear from anyone who would like to help with plans to shape the future of the parish. An interactive display was prepared for the Rusland Show. Please contact the clerk if you have something to contribute; 'no previous experience necessary' as they say.

The Council is pleased to report that after negotiations with the Highways Department, the road from Penny Bridge to Hawkshead, via Colton & Satterthwaite, has been included on the Priority 2 pre-salting list which, we think, means that it may get salted by Council gritters occasionally!"

#### SATTERTHWAITE PARISH NEWS

Work on the Community Plan is progressing well with lots of information you have contributed now being digested. We hope to be moving into the next phase during September with ideas about what we should be doing in the future.

Many of you will have noticed that the parish roads have been decorated with white paint ready for repairs to be carried out. In addition to these minor repairs two major works at Middle Dale and Bowkerstead are waiting for scheduling by the engineers. The work at both sites will lead to road closures and in the case of Bowkerstead this will need to happen during a quiet period. Several other sites that have been subject to flooding have also been investigated and hopefully now resolved. A site visit by the Highways Inspector will take place in October so the Clerk is keen to here of any other problems so that they can be raised at this time.

We have also been informed that the road between Penny Bridge and Hawkshead that passes through the parish has been upgraded to Priority 2, subject to clearance by the Scrutiny Committee, for winter gritting purposes. We have also been promised that grit bins will be replenished before the bad weather arrives.

The Council continues to place pressure on United Utilities to resolve the sewage pollution from the pumping station in Satterthwaite. The matter has now been passed to OFWAT.

#### **Church News**

#### Dear Friends.

The other day I came across something I thought quite interesting. On Washington, DC Metro Station on a cold January morning a man with a violin plays six Bach pieces for about 45 minutes. During that time approximately 2 thousand people passed through the station, most of them on their way to work. It took 3 minutes for anyone to notice him at all-a middle-aged man slowed his pace and stopped for a few seconds and then hurried to meet his schedule.

4 minutes later the violinist received his first dollar: a woman threw the money in the hat and, without stopping, continued to walk.

After 10 minutes, a 3-year old boy stopped but his mother tugged him along hurriedly. The child stopped to look at the violinist again, but the mother pushed hard and the child continued to walk, turning his head all the time. This action was repeated by several other children. Every parent, without exception, forced their children to move on quickly. Over the entire 45 minutes, only 6 people stopped and listened for a short while. About 20 gave money but continued to walk at their normal pace. He finished playing and silence took over. No one noticed and no one applauded. The violinist was a certain Joshua Bell, a very well known violinist. He was playing with a violin valued at \$3.5 million dollars. Two days before, Joshua Bell sold out a theatre in Boston where the price of seats averaged \$100. Joshua Bell playing incognito in the metro station was organized by the Washington Post as part of a social experiment about perception, taste and people's priorities. The questions raised: in a commonplace environment at an inappropriate hour, do we perceive beauty? Do we stop to appreciate it? Do we recognize talent in an unexpected context?

And, of course, it raises the question: if we do not have a moment to stop and listen to one of the best musicians in the world, playing some of the finest music ever written, with one of the most beautiful instruments ever made... what else are we missing?


